A student is writing an argumentative piece for his debate class on why high school students should be allowed to choose all of their classes. Read the paragraphs from the student's argument and the question that follows.

As they stand, high school students' schedules are overwhelming. Because they are forced to take too many classes, these students often struggle overall. When forced to take such varying subjects like literature, science, history, physical education, art, music, and mathematics, students often simply cannot retain all the information thrown at them.
