

The Student Success Plan (SSP)

Every student has a SSP which is an individualized student- centered strategy with these goals in mind.

1. Engage each student based on his/her unique interests and strengths
2. Create an understanding of the relevancy of education
3. Postsecondary educational and career goals are attainable
4. Provide student with support for academic goal- setting towards career, social, emotional, and physical development.

The SSP include supporting activities, such as student portfolios, experiences outside the classroom, dual concurrent credit, along with academic/personal records. Electronic files are recommended for easy access for schools and/or districts transfers.

Naviance

All students have a Naviance account, it's a computer based program used for:

5. Students from middle through high school and their parents.
6. Career interests and style inventories learning, college and career searches, college application process, and scholarship information.



PARENT TIPS: Helping your child(ren) Plan for College and/or Career

1. At beginning of school, meet with counselor discuss attendance, graduation requirements, curriculum, teacher expectations, homework, study skills, and your child's specific goals.
 2. Create a plan together to help your child reach their goals; review it frequently making sure s/he is on track.

In The 11th Grade Classroom

To become ready for college and career, 11th grade students learn to evaluate difficult arguments and overcome the challenges posed by complex written materials independently and confidently. Through reading of literature, students expand their literary and cultural knowledge and better understand references and images. They also develop the flexibility, concentration, and fluency to produce high-quality, first drafts of writing under tight deadlines.

By writing and participating in a variety of conversations, the 11th grade students, will assert and defend claims and show what they know about a subject using examples and evidence. Your child will study math across a broad spectrum. Numerical skill and quantitative reasoning remain crucial even as students move forward with algebra. Algebra, functions, and geometry are important because they are the language of technical subjects and the sciences. Statistics and probability offer powerful ways of drawing conclusions from data and dealing with uncertainty.
