May has finally come which means we will be wrapping up another successful year in our Pre-K class. Miss M is planning a visit and giving us ideas of how to honor our Mothers during Mother's Day. So Mother May I ask you to have your child share some of the

darling songs we are learning on your day and we are sure you will absolutely love our Mother's Day surprise we

are making for you.

Miss M is also bringing in her favorite stories of "When You Give a Mouse a Cookie" and "When You Give a Moose a Muffin". Speaking of Muffins; mark your calendars this month of May for our Muffins for Mom and Donuts for dad that will be coming up soon on May 15th between 8:05 and 8:40 (2nd bell).

Mr. Z, our final letter from Letter People Land will zip in from Zanzibar to talk about zippers, zoos and zebras. We will continue our counting practice to 20 and above. Please continue to read to your child as much as possible as well as practice and review letters and numbers over the summer months.

It is time to say our final good byes this month and in doing so we would like to wish our rising Kindergarten friends farewell and good luck next year. Isaac, Valen, Alex, Grayson, Aristides and Nethius will be off next year to new adventures we wish them all the very best. For those of our friends who

will be returning next school year we wish you a safe and fun summer and we will see you next year (Monday, August 12, 2019). Please remember early dismissal days will be begin Thursday, May 24^{th} , 25^{th} and 28^{th} at 1 pm. School will also be closed in honor of Memorial Day on Monday, May 27th.

Our students had a great time with our inhouse zoo field trip! As our last month of school approaches we will continue the framework and enjoy unit on oceans, ocean life, and summer fun. To ensure your child is ready for first grade, please continue reading and writing on a daily basis. Students will be assessed on all sight words by the end of the year.

In math, we will be continuing our unit on measurement and being able to sort and classify data and use graphs to find information. continue to work with your child on addition and subtraction to ten, counting to 100 and beyond by ones and tens, and correctly writing and forming numbers. One of our social studies standards is that the student can name personal information such as their address and phone number. We encourage you to practice this at home over the next few weeks.

Our end of the year party will be a Splash Day celebration. More information will be sent home in the coming weeks. We are looking forward to a wonderful end to our year!

Hello First Grade Families! This is the last month of the school year, which is always a bittersweet time for students and teachers. While we are so excited for summer, we will miss each other very much. This month we

will treasure each and every experience we have together. We are excited about our End of the Year Party on May 24. If you are able to volunteer, please let your child's teacher know. We will need you from 8-12, and you must be an approved Dividend.

Just because the school year is almost over, does not mean that we have stopped working. On the contrary, this is a wonderful time where we can use the skills we've gained this year to tackle more difficult assignments. In Literacy, we will read a variety of nonfiction texts on a topic and compile the facts to create a report. What a genuine link between reading and writing that will be! We are also working on Computer Literacy lessons in the classroom using iPads and Puzzlets. The students just love these lessons, and they are actually learning the basics of writing computer code! In Math, we will practice measuring length using both inches/feet and centimeters/meters. If you've got a ruler at home, be sure to take it out so your child can practice. Remind your child to always start at the correct end of the ruler, and not to measure from the middle! Our final Science unit focuses on Heredity, where we will learn that while plant and animal young resemble their parents, there are still differences between them. In Social Studies, we will learn about Economics, focusing in on wants and needs, and supply and demand.

Over the summer, please have your child read as much as possible so he/she doesn't regress. Your child's teacher can recommend some titles or authors that are appropriate for his/her level. Also, have your child practice addition and subtraction facts through 10. They should know these sums and differences automatically, without having to count on or back. As we reflect on this amazing year we have spent together, we thank you from the bottoms of our hearts for your enduring support and love. We wish you and your families all the best in the future.

It's hard to believe we are coming to the end of our school year. Time flies when you're working hard and learning so much! During our last month, we will be finishing up measurement as well as addition and subtraction of three digit numbers. We are reviewing and drawing conclusions in reading as well as identifying the author's purpose, comparing and contrasting as well as finding facts and details in a passage utilizing biographies, and sequencing events in a story.

Scientifically, we moved from the study of life cycles to the basic needs of plants and animals and the study of their habitats. We have released butterflies and gone on our final away from school field trip. Please check with your child's teacher to find out which night your annual music show is. It is a tradition here at Eastbrook and lots of fun!

Finally, we have a week of fun planned with Themed Days and our End of the Year Party is scheduled for Wednesday, May 22nd, but we still have a lot of learning to do before then! Please contact your child's teacher if you are a registered dividend for the 2018-2019 school year and would like to volunteer your time for the End of the Year Party. It will be very similar to our Holiday Celebration, but with summer themed activities. Look for more information to come.

Second Grade Teachers

Eastbrook Local News: Intermediate Classes

It's hard to believe that we're entering the last month of the 2018-2019 school year! As our students prepare for their final phase of FSA testing for this year, we're reviewing the following skills during Math Boot Camp: multiplying and dividing within 100, solving problems using the four operations, applying the properties of operations, adding and subtracting within 1000, locating fractions on a number line, determining equivalent fractions, comparing fractions, drawing and interpreting data on a scaled bar graph and picture graph, telling time to the nearest minute, measuring length to the nearest half and quarter inch, measuring liquid volume and mass, identifying attributes of two-dimensional shapes and calculating the measurement of the unknown side when the perimeter or area is given. Please review these skills with your student in preparation for the Math FSA on May 7th and 8th

In addition to the FSA, our third grade students will be taking their 3rd iReady Reading Diagnostic Assessment the week of May 13th and the iReady Math Diagnostic Assessment the week of May 20th. Prior to each assessment it's important that your student gets plenty of rest and has a nutritious breakfast.

In celebration of the end of the school year, third grade will have an autograph party, third grade party, and an ice cream party. Watch for upcoming information about these events.

We hope you have a relaxing summer and look forward to seeing you in August!

It's hard to believe that we are nearing the end of the 4th grade year! FSA Reading testing is on May 1st and 2nd, and FSA Math is May 7th and 8th. Please continue to send your child to school prepared for testing by making sure they get lots of rest and eat a good breakfast! Reading classes are finishing the year off learning about Florida by reading about and studying different aspects of Florida's history and economy. Students will also be working on other Florida-related projects before the end of the year. We are excited to spend these remaining weeks on projects and preparing for 5th grade! The last few weeks of school are always very exciting for the kids. We are working on math projects that review the skills we've learned this year. We are also getting ready for 5th grade math by learning the order of operations, points on a grid, and 2-digit division, just to name a few! It is expected that fifth graders be fluent in their multiplication facts, so please continue to practice at home. Our annual kickball tournament will be Tuesday, May 21st, so please keep an eye out for the invitation that will be sent home. Teachers will also be sending notices about end-of-year events and parties, so please make sure you continue to monitor Class Dojo and your child's binder daily!

Fifth Grade is working on wrapping up the year. We are getting ready for our FSA Exams coming up in May. Students are reviewing material in class and maybe at home too. Students in 5th Grade take an ELA, Math, and Science Exam. Please keep in mind the testing dates and make sure your child gets rest, a good breakfast, and is at school on time the days of testing. Please make sure to check Skyward so that your child has all of their work submitted to their teacher.

On Friday, May 17th, 2019 5th Grade is attending an End of Year Trip to Oviedo. There we will go to District Eat and Play. This will occur during the normally scheduled school day. On May 21st, we will hold our annual 5th Grade Awards Ceremony where parents are welcome and encouraged to attend. May 23rd is our 5th Grade Biography Brunch from 9:30-10:30. Parents once again are welcome to attend this event. Keep in mind the last 3 days of school are early dismissal and the last day of school is Tuesday, May 28th. On behalf of the 5th Grade Team, we would like to thank you for a wonderful year. We wish you a relaxing summer. Best wishes in middle school next year.

Tips for Reducing Test Anxiety

The most important thing that you can do to reduce your child's test anxiety is not to get stressed yourself because they will pick up on your stress. Trust that they are prepared and ready. Below you will find some tips and techniques to help your child reduce their test anxiety.

- -Get plenty of rest and sleep the night before the test.
- -Have your child dress comfortably. Layers are helpful.
- -Arrive early on testing days to get free breakfast!
- -Don't listen to any negative talk around you. Think only positive thoughts, push negative thoughts away and replace them with positive ones.

Recommended Techniques

Engage in deep breathing for 2-5 minutes. Close your eyes and concentrate on the air going in and out of your lungs. Take long, deep breaths, fill your lungs and abdomen, hold your breath, and then exhale.

Engage in guided imagery for a few minutes. Pick a scene that you find peaceful, beautiful, and natural. Think about what you see, what you hear, what you feel and what you smell while in this scene.

Consider teaching your child how to use positive affirmations. For example, "I am going to rock this test!"

For the final quarter of this year, we are focusing on reflecting on our work. As we complete each step of the process, students will reflect on predicting the outcome, analyzing what is working and what is not, and looking back at the project as whole to decide what could be improved or changed. We continue to talk about growth mindset in all that we do.



With springtime here, a few classes will be working on life science projects. First graders will be constructing a structure that can hold netting to protect the growing caterpillars from one of their predators, the wasp. We are (hopefully) growing milkweed in our classroom. Fifth graders will be working on an environmental engineering project to beautify our butterfly garden.

Fourth grade students will be building a working windmill and can discuss how windmills can help the Earth by creating clean power. Third graders will be researching how a solar oven is constructed and how it can be used to heat food. Second graders will be creating a boat that can float and be moved only by magnets. Finally, the kindergartners are celebrating becoming 1st graders by creating letters that can stand to be used as a banner.

Thank you for all of your support this year! It has been a fantastic year and so proud of each student's accomplishments.
