District Goals

By (May, 2018) all students will be at grade level or higher in (English/Language Arts). We will get there by increasing each student's writing:

- Writing (topic sentences and well –developed supporting details (more text-based evidence).
- Conventions (subject-verb agreement, punctuation, and spelling) across all grade levels by 8% over 2 years).

By (May, 2018), all students will be at grade level or higher in Reading we will get there by increasing each students phonic skills, fluency, and comprehension of nonfiction text across all grade levels by 6% over 2 years.

By (May, 2018, all students will be at grade level or higher in Math, we will get there by increasing K-2 student's :

 Counting, addition and subtraction skills within 20, place value, grouping in tens and ones across all grade levels by 14% over 2 years.

By (May, 2018) all students will be at grade level or higher in Math, we will get there by increasing 3-5 student's:

Multiplication and division within 100, addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators, developing fractions and equivalent fractions especially fractions with numerator 1. Across all grade levels by 14% over 2 years.

School Goals

During the 2017-18 school year, the percentage of K-5 students meeting/exceeding standards in <u>Reading and Math</u> at Huie Elementary School will increase by 5 % to meet the performance targets set by the state of Georgia in each grade level as measured by the English/Language Arts/Math Student Learning Objectives (Grades 1 and 2).

By (May, 2018), all students will be at grade level or higher in Reading we will get there by increasing each students phonic skills, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension of nonfiction text across all grade levels by 6% over 2 years.
