It has been a very busy month at Ketterlinus and very exciting things will be happening. 
CALLING ALL PUMPKINS!






*No "scary" costumes or masks - Ex: Hockey or "Scream" masks


*No weapon props

The surrogate parent represents the interests of the child in all areas relating to the exceptional student education process and the provision of a free appropriate public education. A surrogate parent is not someone who takes care of the child (like an adoptive parent or a foster parent). A surrogate parent is not financially responsible for the child.

Surrogate parents have a very important role. They help the child and the school; they also help their community meet the needs of its exceptional students. The rewards for surrogate parents: the opportunity to share your time, use your skills, build relationships and see the results in your own community and in the life of a child.

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Dear Parents of KES 3rd 4th and 5th Graders,

Beginning MONDAY, NOVEMEBR 5TH 2012 your student will be studying the RECORDER (a song flute-like instrument) throughout the rest of the 2012-2013 School Year. Playing the recorder is a vital part of an elementary music class experience. It is an opportunity for every child to own and care for their personal musical instrument and the benefits are numerous including:

- Improves note-reading skills and develops musicianship
- Provides an instrument for improvisation and personal expression
- Develops ensemble performance skills
- Transitions them to various middle school band instruments in the coming years

Many students already own a recorder from previous years here at Ketterlinus or from another school. **IF YOU OWN A RECORDER, YOU DO NOT NEED TO BUY A NEW ONE.** If you need to purchase a new recorder, please send a check or cash with the students name on it in the amount of <u>\$5.00</u>. All 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students here at Ketterlinus are **required** to have their recorder with them every day. If there is a financial hardship, please send a note to me and we will help provide one for the student.

Here are a few helpful hints to help ensure your child's success on this instrument:

- Be sure that the students names are labeled underneath their recorders
- Be sure that your recorder stays in your BACK-PACK EVERY DAY
- Only take your recorder out in 2 places: 1) HOME and 2) MUSIC ROOM

Literacy Coaches Corner

Florida schools are transitioning to new learning standards called Common Core. Florida, along with 45 other states, is working together by teaching the same standards to all children. As teachers transition from previous standards to the new ones, students will see changes in what is expected of them in the classroom. This space is dedicated to informing parents of the subtle changes, as well as challenges, these new standards bring to our children's education.

Language Arts Tip:

Kindergarten students are writers, too! Although they are learning the fundamentals of letters, sounds, and everything that goes along with learning how letters make words, students will be practicing drawing, dictating, and writing to share their opinions about books and other topics. Students will learn and practice this important building block by watching their teacher read a book, then they will respond out loud to the book, write words and draw pictures that represent their response to the book. How can parents model this important skill at home? As you read with your child, don't just stick to the words in the book. Stop frequently and comment on what is happening. Ask your child questions on what they think will happen next, if they agree with the characters choices, or what they would do differently if they were the star of the book. Then, write a simple opinion or response to the book on blank paper. Draw a picture that represents what happened in the story, while your child does the same thing. Its OK if they cannot spell or write all the words will surely try to write. Help them write and spell as many words as they want. Together, show them how to correct misspelled words by writing the correctly spelled word in small letters above their words. By encouraging children to write their thoughts on the same page as the picture, you are reinforcing what teachers do each day... teaching children how words and pictures create stories. By practicing this rewarding activity with your child, your child will learn the valuable process of how images and words work together to create a unified story, which will ultimately prepare your child for their life as successful student
