8th Grade Math

This week we will work on standards MGSE8.EE3, MGSE.EE.4, and MGSE8.EE.7. Students will finish the scientific notation unit and then begin a solving equations unit. Students will solve multi-step equations that contain combing like terms, the distributive property, and fractions.

Accelerated Algebra I

This week students will work on standards MGSE9-12.F.BF.4 and MGSE9-

12.N.RN.2. Students will finish the arithmetic sequences and functions unit and then begin an operations with radicals unit. Students will simplify, add, subtract, multiply, and divide radicals.

Georgia Studies

Students will begin a new unit on The Impact of Civil War on Georgia. Students will explain the importance of key issues and events that led to the Civil War including slavery, states' rights, nullification, Compromise of 1850, the Georgia Platform, the Missouri Compromise, the Dred Scott case, the election of 1860, and the debate over secession in Georgia. Students will also explain Georgia's role in the Civil War including the Union blockade of Georgia's coast, the Emancipation Proclamation, Chickamauga, Sherman's Atlanta Campaign, Sherman's March to the Sea, and Andersonville Confederate Prison. Key Terms and Vocabulary: states' rights, Civil War, slavery, nullification controversy, Missouri Compromise, Compromise of 1850, Georgia Platform, Dred Scott, Election of 1860, Abraham Lincoln, blockade, Emancipation Proclamation, Battle of Chickamauga, Atlanta Campaign, General William Tecumseh Sherman, March to the Sea, Andersonville Confederate Prison
