

Risk Management Statistics 17-18 v 18-19

Sick Bank Enrollment:: 17-18 we had 43 new enrollee's. 18-19 we had 81 new enrollee's. Sick Leave Bank is an excellent program. It is a 100% employee funded program that allows employees to extend a helping hand to colleagues who are of like mind and appreciate the benefit of sharing resources to assist others. It provides additional sick leave days to members in the event of an unexpected extended catastrophic illness or injury. It is not the intent of the Sick Leave Bank to provide additional days off for elective surgery, or to be used in lieu of a health leave or prior to retirement or resignation. If you are not a member, you can enroll November 2019 as long as you are eligible. You must have 9 sick days by December 2019 to be eligible.

W.C. Incidents: 17-18 (7/1/2017-11/27/2017) 129 incidents. 18-19 (7/1/2018-11/27/2018) 129 incidents. Most of the incidents are Trips /Falls and Strain from lifting. **To help prevent slips and trips**: Clean up spills immediately. Keep walkways and hallways free of debris, clutter and obstacles. Keep filing cabinets and desk drawers shut when not in use. Cover cables or cords in walkways. **To prevent lifting injuries:** Lift with your knees and legs, not with your back. Keep it close. Grasp the load firmly and lift it toward your belt buckle. Hold the load close to your body to avoid putting pressure on your back. If something is too heavy, ask someone to



Employees are responsible for reporting work related injuries immediately, (next working day if after normal business hours with exceptions of emergencies) even if you feel no medical treatment is needed.

Report the injury to the Cost Center Administrator/Designee.

<u>Complete</u> an incident report. Information you will need: date and time of accident, description (including the cause of the injury, location, what you were doing and the body part(s) that were affected). Be very detailed regarding the injury/illness that occurred (bruise, scratch, ache, sting, pain).

<u>Submit</u> the Incident Report through your Cost Center's Worker's Compensation contact to Melinda Buckingham in Risk Management. ALL initial medical treatment is to be arranged and pre-authorized through the Risk Management Office. (Except in emergencies) DO NOT give the provider your personal insurance information. Identify yourself as a School Board employee with a work-related injury.

<u>Communicate</u> with the Workers Comp contact at your Cost Center throughout the process. Provide the work status certificate after each appointment or follow up visit. As the Worker's Comp contact for a work comp RX card (PMOA) to avoid any out of pocket expenses for prescriptions.

- Use Preferred Specialty pharmacies for specialty drugs.
- Use Preferred providers for medical equipment and supplies.
- Choose generic drugs when available.
- Compare drug costs for your plan -available online and on mobile devices!

Fire Safety In the Classroom

Keep storage to a minimum (Excessive storage increases the fire load; which in turn increases all aspects of a fire).

Storage areas are kept in a safe and orderly condition.

Clear and unobstructed walkway through storage area.

No storage is allowed within 24 inches of the ceiling of a building without sprinklers.

No storage is allowed within 18 inches of the ceiling of a building with sprinklers.

36 inches of unobstructed access is provided to all electrical & fire alarm panels.
