Eastbrook Local News: Primary Classes

VE We hope you and your family enjoyed your Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends. The children have been sharing stories of family gatherings and our sumptuous feasts. Before we went on holiday break we discussed what we might be eating during our Thanksgiving feast. Many children shared that they loved apple pie and stuffing but were not so fond of the turkey. Perhaps they may have felt some sympathy for our poor turkey friend?

Through the month of December we will continue to work on fine motor skills, i.e., puzzles, playdough, manipulative counting and stringing beads, etc. For those students who will be transitioning to kindergarten next year we will be concentrating on handwriting activities especially on writing their names correctly by using only one initial cap followed by smaller case letters, for example: John (not JOHN). Please practice writing your child's name cor-

rectly at home.

Since December continues with all the magical holiday joy, we hope to capture that joyfulness towards new learning. Mr. "J" plans on arriving right on time with his "jingle-jingle jacket" from Letter People Land. He is bringing his jingle bells for our own jingle bell parade. Mr. R will follow with many Reindeer tales especially the most famous of all - Rudolph! Mr. R has a fondness for rainbows and will be bringing his many colored scarves for his own Rainbow Parade!

We hope you enjoy sharing with your child all the joy and happiness this season brings as much as we do! We wish you and your family the warmest holiday wishes and ill see you again when school resumes on January 7, 2019.

December is an exciting time in Kindergarten. Our reading and language framework continue with rigor and differentiated instruction. We will focus on fiction/nonfiction, compare and contrast, story plot/setting, and problem solution. During this timeframe, students should recognize all upper and lower case letters and their sounds. Students should be able to use these letter sounds in their beginning reading and writing activities. As you review your child's classwork and journal entries, please praise your child for their reading and writing progress. Simple c-v-c (consonant-vowel-consonant) words are a great place to start.

In math, we will continue to learn about 2D (flat) and 3D (solid) shapes. You can help your child practice these skills by identifying shapes around the house or the store. Discuss how they can move (roll, stack, slide), how many sides and vertices they have, and how you can use the shapes to create other objects.

Our social studies unit will focus on Holidays Around the World. The kindergarten students will travel to other classrooms for this unit to learn about the diverse customs celebrated at this time of year. Our month will conclude with a Holiday Party. More information to come and volunteers will be needed. You will need to be an approved Dividend to help out at the party as well. The kindergarten team would like to wish everyone a wonderful Winter Break and a Happy New Year!

Happy December, First
Grade Families! We hope
you had a wonderful Thanksgiving with your family and friends,
and we are sure the holiday excitement is starting to build! We find
that it is best to stick to your nor-



mal routines as much as possible in the weeks leading up to the holidays. Young children need predictability and consistency! We will continue to work hard in December. In Reading, we will learn to identify the author's reasons for including information in a text. We will also learn to connect information both within a text and across several texts. In Writing, we will finish up our informational writing and learn to write explanatory texts. In Math, we will learn about place value in two digit numbers. This is a crucial topic in first grade, so we will be sure to do lots of hands-on activities to help develop our understanding. In Science, we will learn all about stars. Most children are excited to learn about space, so we are really looking forward to this unit. In Social Studies, we will learn about various holidays and festivals around the world. We will also learn about maps and many of the landforms that make up our Earth.

As you are making your December plans, please don't forget that December 18th, 19th, and 20th are Early Release days, and dismissal will be at 1:00, and December 21st is a teacher planning day, so no school for students. We hope that you and your family have an enjoyable, restful holiday break and Happy New Year! As always, we thank you for your support!

Thank you so much to the parents who chaperoned our fieldtrip to Wonder Works. The students had an amazing time! We will have a short month in December due to our holiday break. We plan on having a Winter Celebration before we leave for break and will be looking for volunteers as well as donations to make the celebration a success. We will still have homework and encourage you to continue to support your child as they read, practice the spelling pattern from the homework and work on math flashcards. We are comparing similar texts and continuing to look for evidence to answer the questions about what we have read. We are encouraging your student to look at the details. We will be working on adverbs in grammar, since we have already covered nouns, verbs and adjectives.

In Math we are moving from 2-digit subtraction to bigger and better things as we start representing and interpreting data that is found on graphs and charts. In Science we continue with Energy. We have enjoyed learning about the United States of America, our government, it's symbols, and the Constitution.

Good readers get that way through practice. Set aside some time each day to read with your child, ask them questions and share a good book. You could also take this opportunity to practice good old-fashioned flash cards for math, or work on the site math-drills so that your child is fluent in that area as well. You will enjoy the time spent with each other. Thank you for your continued support. If we work together, we can help your child become all that they can be. Enjoy the holidays with your family.

Eastbrook Local News: Intermediate Classes

December is here and 3rd graders have been working really hard!
In reading, we've been reading several informa-

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tional articles and reviewing text structure, main idea and details, and author's point of view. We will be diving into informational writing this month and focusing on analyzing writing prompts.

As we wrap up our multiplication and division unit in math, please make sure your child continues to practice their math facts at home throughout the school year, as knowing their facts fluently is the goal by the end of third grade. Understanding fractions is our next unit of focus. Students will be learn how to identify and represent, and compare fractions using various strategies.

In science we have been learning about types of energy and will be focusing on light energy! Students have also been learning about the purpose of government and how it gets its power. We are so excited for our upcoming field trip to see The Nutcracker on December 13th. Please make sure all permission slips have been turned in. Your child's teacher will be in contact about chaperones.

Winter is here and we have been working really hard in 4th grade! Reading students are working on non-fiction texts, discovering main idea and understanding the difference between firsthand and secondhand accounts. We've also been learning a lot about text-based writing in preparation for the FSA writing test. In Social Studies, students completed a big project that answered the question "Why Did Spain Settle St. Augustine?" Ask your student for the answer!

In math classes, fourth graders have been learning about equivalent fractions including simplest form and common denominators. They will now use that skill to add and subtract, rename them into a mixed number, and multiply a fraction by a whole number. Fluent multiplication helps with these concepts so continue to practice basic math facts using XtraMath.org or flashcards!

Our St. Augustine trip is rapidly approaching and we have a bit of money left to raise before we will be able to go on this amazing adventure! Please make sure you get your permission slips and payments in to your student's teacher before the December 20th due date. Also, there will be lots of information coming home regarding celebrations, half-days and more over the next few weeks so please be sure to check your child's binder regularly for upcoming events.

Fifth Grade has been working hard! In Reading students have been working on Main Idea and Supporting Details. Not only have we been working on find the Main Idea of the articles but also in chunks throughout the story. They have been finding quotes from the story to support the main idea. In Writing they have been using strategies to do informational and opinion writing. They are preparing for the Writing portion of the FSA in the Spring.

In Math students have been working on multiplying decimals and using a variety of strategies when doing so. Please help us to be sure that students are getting their 46 minutes of I Ready in Reading and Math each week. Students have time in class. However, if they are absent or if they do not have their 46 minutes by Thursday we suggest to work on it at home.


