

English/Language Arts	4 units including: 1 unit of 9th grade Lit/Comp 1 unit of American Lit/Comp
Mathematics	4 units of math including: 1 unit of Math 1 1 unit of Math 2 1 unit of Math 3 1 additional Math unit chosen from of GPS/AP/IB designated courses
Science	4 units of science including: 1 unit of Biology (can be AP/IB) 1 unit of Physical Science or Physics (AP/IB) 1 unit of Chemistry, Earth Systems, Environmental Science or an AP/IB course 1 unit of a 4yr, including any AP/IB, academic science, or career tech science

High School Graduation Requirements

Electives	7 units of electives required 3 units must be in: CTAE and/or; Foreign Language; and/or Fine Arts Students are encouraged to earn two units in the same language (required for entry into the University System of Georgia)





Preparing For College 2. College Application- Admission Options

Early Admission Options: Apply prior to October 15

Early Decision- Binding/Not binding/Apply to only one early decision college/2 deadlines (EDDI) or (EDDII); must withdraw application to all other colleges if accepted

Early Action-Not binding/Apply to more than one early action college/can accept right away or wait for regular admission

Single-Choice Early Action-Apply to only one early action college/can accept right away or wait for regular admission

Regular Admission- Apply prior to January 1

How can you improve your GPA?

How it relates to scholarships/college acceptance?

Grade point average (GPA)

How to calculate GPA?

Assign the numeric grade earned to a value

Ex: Econ 94=4.0, Eng Lit. 85=3.0, etc

Add all the values together and divide by the number of courses.

Ex. Biology 75=2

Eng 85=3

Econ 95=4

Math 70=1

Total 10 divided by 4 = 2.5 GPA

Why is your GPA important?	It is an important factor when applying for admission to college and when applying for scholarships.
How to increase your GPA?	Taking more classes and doing well in the classes you take.

3. Overall GPA VS Hope GPA

Overall GPA includes all classes in which the student has attempted

Hope GPA includes all academic courses attempted and world language courses

Fine Art/PE/Health courses are not included in the Hope GPA

Courses taken for high school credit in middle school are NOT included in the Hope GPA

3. Hope Scholarship-Eligibility

Determine after final grades from spring semester are uploaded by the county to Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC)

Student SSN is required via gafutures to be eligible for the Hope Scholarship

Preparing For College 4. Scholarship

There are a wide range of scholarships available to students. Some are based on your academics (merit scholarships) other are based on your interests

Take advantage of all scholarship opportunities for which you are eligible to apply. Meet any deadlines

5. FAFSA-Free Application for Federal Student Aid

Provides student financial assistance in the form of:

Grants- state and federal; do not have to repay; based on financial need

Scholarships-Awarded based on merit or high academic achievement; do not have to repay

Loans-Public and Private; have to be repaid

Work-study funds- opportunity to work and earn money while in college to pay for college expenses

- 1. Pathway completion 3 units in one Fine Arts area (dance, music, theatre, and visual arts).
- 2. Completed one additional unit in a fine arts course and being involved in two fine arts related extracurricular activities OR one unit in a CTAE course that provides creative industry skill focus. EX. Journalism, Oral/Written Communication, Economics.
- 3. 20 Hours of Community Service
- 4. Capstone Presentation
- 5. Written reflection of fine arts community service activities and experiences your gained.

Fine Arts Diploma Seal-Community Service Types of Approved Service

- Painting Murals at Elementary Schools/Senior Centers
- Dance Team, Band, Choir, Praise Team, Orchestra at Religious Organization
- Designing/Maintaining Website for religious organization
- Flyer or non-profit event/agency
- Singing/playing an instrument at senior citizens center
- Singing/playing for homeless shelter
- Singing/playing during a toy drive
- Dramatic reading at elementary schools
- Tutoring in the community in a fine arts area
- Community concert
- Photographer at a community service event
- Volunteering at a summer camp or Arts Camp using fine arts area skills
