Reading



In reading, we are now shifting to the new Florida B.E.S.T. Standards. This year, we have a new comprehension curriculum and phonics program to help our students be successful with these new standards.

Our big focus on reading in first grade includes (but is not limited to):

- -Phonics and Phonemic Awareness
- -Fluency
- -Literary Elements
- -Comprehension of Fiction and Non-Fiction Texts
- -Text Features in Informational Texts



Writing



Our writing goals in first grade include:

- Writing a complete simple sentence.
- Understanding when to use capital letters, punctuation, and grammatical conventions.
- Using a tool called 4 Square Writing to become a better writer.

About 4 Square Writing: This tool is designed to scaffold the writing process. At the beginning of the year, students will begin drawing pictures to describe what they want to write about. This progresses into labeling pictures then to writing full complete sentences. At the end of the year, students will be writing a paragraph focused around the topic of the week or topic for the unit.


Math

In first grade, our biggest focus is helping our students create foundational skills and understanding of important math concepts. First grade focuses on the following skills:

-Adding and Subtracting (we will add and subtract to 100 by the end of


the year)

Science and Social Studies





Science

 During our Science block we use the HMH Florida Science textbook to help guide our studies. This year we will be focusing on how scientists work, technology, space, Earth's resources, matter and motion, plants and living thing, and more. To deepen the student's understanding we reinforce these topics by doing S.T.E.A.M projects and experiments within the units.

Social studies

• For Social Studies we use Studies Weekly. Students will learn about rules, time, history, maps, festivals, and holidays, and much more. During this time, we continue to work on our social skills that we learn weekly throughout the school year and focus on progressing good reading practices.

In 1st grade, we use "M", "P", or "I" to determine the level of student performance.




Behavior & Communication

- First grade follows our school wide PBIS program and focuses on positive reinforcement.
- We have individual, class, and grade level incentives. Eagle eggs are given out to classes who are walking in the hallway correctly and using SOAR expectations at resource. Once the grade level gets to 50 Eagle eggs, we earn a reward.
- Teachers can be reached by email, phone, note, or other preferred communication (i.e. Dojo or Remind). Please allow up to 24 hours for a response as we are not always available to immediately respond.
- Please contact your teacher if you wish to set up a meeting before parent/teacher conferences.

Homework (Or Un-Homework)

Un-homework is a friendly homework alternative that offers the following:



- Student Choice (Un-Homework is not graded or mandatory)
- Incentives (Students are not punished for not doing homework; in fact, they earn chances for reward by choosing to do the work)
- Saved Time (Choices offered are brief, hands-on, explorations that will eliminate frustration and encourage empowered learning!)
