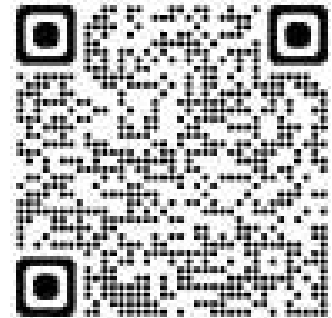

The class of 2023 is partnering with Savers for a FunDrive Fundraiser!

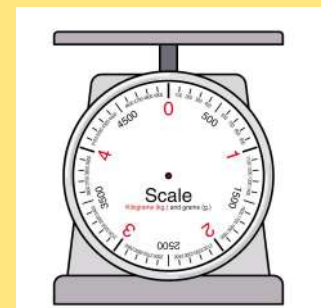

Aloha,

Leilehua High School is pleased to announce that students can now register for the COVID-19 testing program. Our COVID-19 testing program with PerkinElmer and COLOR Health is free, no insurance is required, and uses the self-swab anterior nasal (AN) PCR dry, self-swab test. Testing takes no longer than 15 minutes. Results will be available in 3-4 days.

A parent or guardian must register a minor under 18 years old. When you register, you will give a one-time consent and HIPAA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act) authorization to share your child's results with the school and district.

In order for your child to participate in testing, you will need to register with COLOR using the following link or QR code. You will need to complete a separate registration for each child, and you will only need to register once to participate in more than one testing opportunity. There will be no onsite registration.

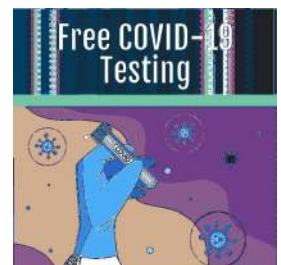
Every Monday and Thursday from 7am - 9am at the Stadium Ticket Booth area.

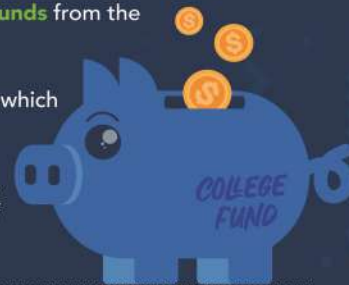

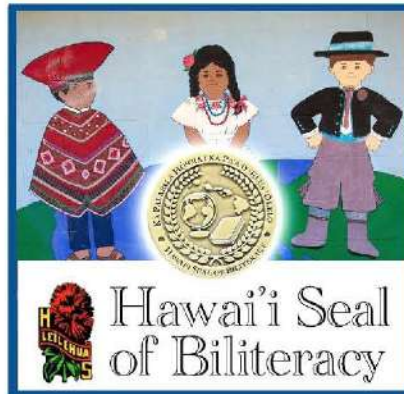

Class of 2022

Is your child proficient in another language?

- On track to have a minimum 3.0 GPA in required English Language Arts courses for graduation?
- On track to have a minimum 3.0 Cumulative GPA upon graduation?

If your answer is yes to all of the above....Did you know that your child could be eligible for special recognition and an award called the Seal of Biliteracy? Currently 40 States and Washington DC have a Seal of Biliteracy.

The Seal of Biliteracy is for ANY graduate who meets both GPA requirements and attains the HIDOE determined requisite score on a HIDOE-approved language assessment. It is NOT only for students who take a world language class. There is a long list of languages that students can be assessed on, including Marshallese, Samoan, Tagalog and American Sign Language for example.

Class of 2022 deadlines to submit an application to the state:

Applicants taking the AP language exam THIS school year - No later than 12:00pm on Monday, November 1st.

All other Class of 2022 applicants - No later than 12:00pm on Monday, November 8th.

Potential applicants must be screened before submitting their applications to ensure applicants are on track to meet the language arts and cumulative GPA requirements.
