■ **3. INSURE DOMESTIC TRANQUILITY**

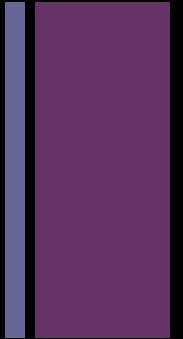
■ To maintain *peace* and *order*, keeping citizens and property *safe* from harm.

■ **6. SECURE THE BLESSINGS TO OURSELVES AND OUR POSTERITY**

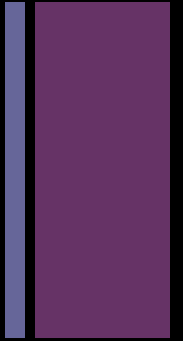
- To guarantee the freedom and basic rights of all Americans, including future generations (“posterity”).

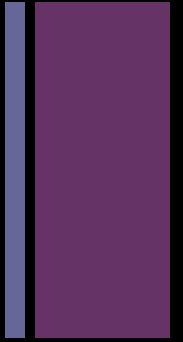
- 1. U.S. troops are sent to the nearby island of Haiti to help maintain order when the Haitian government is overthrown.





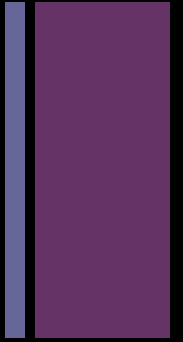

- 2. State police were sent into Ferguson, Missouri to settle unrest between upset citizens and local police after the shooting death of Michael Brown.





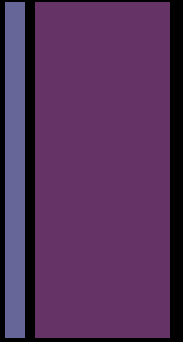

- 3. U.S troops prepare for a raid on an Iraqi town where terrorists are believed to be operating and plotting another attack against the United States.



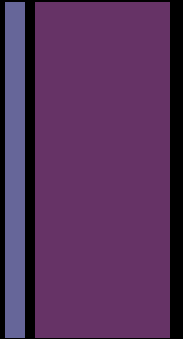

- 4. The Department of Agriculture puts out a new food pyramid which helps people plan a healthy diet.



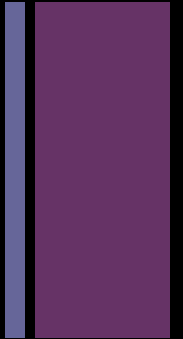

- 5. The Treasury Department issues paper money and mints coins for the entire country



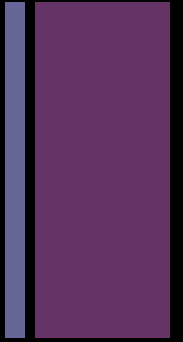

- 6. The Department of Energy provides funding for research on wind energy so that it may help us reduce our reliance on oil.



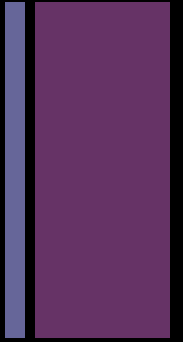

- 7. The Department of Transportation maintains the nation's interstate highway system. Repairing highways that connect the various states in the country.



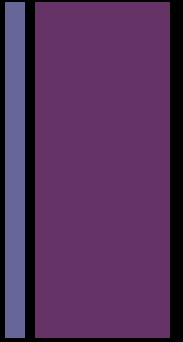

- **8. The Veterans Administration operates hospitals where people who have served in the military can receive health care services.**



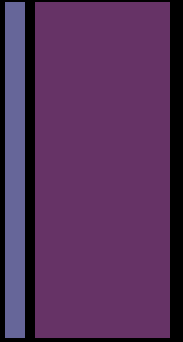

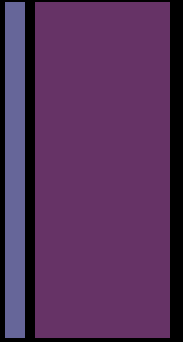


- 14. The federal government provides disaster relief funding for communities struck by spring floods and tornados.
