Student Expectations:

To log in and register for Google Classroom:

- Go to “classroom.google.com” (consider bookmarking this page).
- Sign in with your HCS Gmail account. If you are already signed in with another Gmail account, you will need to sign out of that account and sign in with the HCS account in order to get access.
- To sign in:
 - Enter username: [Your Student ID #]@henry.k12.ga.us (*this is your HCS email*)
 - Password: [Your computer password at school], and click “Sign-In.”
- Your role is “student”.
- You must register for our class live lesson/office hours and English proctoring. Enter the registration code, and click “Join.” If you are already using Google Classroom for another class, click on the “+” sign in the upper right corner of your screen and select join a class.

Completing Coursework:

- a. Actively work in your literature course every day, for at least 60-90 minutes.
- b. Participate in Live Lessons if there are no schedule conflicts with zoned school classes, the Academy of Advanced Studies, or dual enrollment in college courses.
- c. Communicate with your teachers anytime you fail an assessment, including quizzes, tests, essays, and/or projects.
- d. All assessments must be proctored in the English Assessment Proctoring Google Class via Go Guardian.
- e. Take notes on all virtual instruction in your course - this is a requirement.
- f. Check your EMAIL at least twice a day.
- g. Assignment Retakes-Text or email me to request an assignment reset (test and exam REVIEWS also count as assignments in the grade book). Once I have activated it, you can go to that item to complete it. After you have completed the retake, the system will automatically send you back where you were working.
- h. Quiz Corrections-Instead of retakes for quizzes, please send me your corrected responses to the items you got incorrect on each quiz. Be sure to use the correct number of the quiz question so I know exactly which items to compare. I will review the changes you share with me, and update the quiz score. You are allowed ONE quiz correction attempt per quiz.
- i. Test Retakes-Because test items lock after being viewed, you can not do corrections for them. Please send notes for all of the lessons in the unit related to the tests you wish to retake. I will

review the notes and add the retake. If you took your notes in the eNotes section of Edgenuity, please let me know that as you won't have to send them to me. I can look from my teacher portal, and save you the extra work time.

- j. There are no retakes on the midterm or end-of-year exams.

Academic Honesty and Plagiarism Policy:

- a. All students are expected to do his or her own work.
- b. To ensure that each student is completing his or her own work, students will be asked to come to Impact at least twice per course to have an assessment proctored by their instructor.
- c. Students are expected to always submit their own work. Plagiarizing from the Internet, or any other source violates the Student Code of Ethics and Honesty Policy as stated in the Henry County Student Handbook. In addition, if a student submits the work of another student, sibling, or friend, this is too a violation of this policy. When a student is caught plagiarizing or submitting another's work, the following steps are taken:
 - i. 1st Violation: The student receives a zero on the assessment without the option to redo or revise the assignment.
 - ii. 2nd Violation: Students will receive a zero on the assessment, and a parent conference will be scheduled with Mr. Thompson and the teacher. Students may also receive a discipline referral.
 - iii. 3rd Violation: In addition to the steps in (B) students will also be recommended to be unenrolled from the Impact Academy Blended Learning Program and returned to his/her home school.

- Edgenuity automatically grades your quizzes and tests, and these scores are reported immediately after they are taken.
- Writing assignments and projects are graded by the instructor and can take more time to receive feedback and scores.
- Always review the feedback and comments in regards to writing assignments and projects. You should also check emails for any feedback that your teacher may send to you. Oftentimes, the instructor will provide suggestions as to how you can revise your work to receive a higher grade.
- Your actual grade is reported to Infinite Campus during Grade Postings.
