## About Forsyth County Schools

FCS serves over 50,600 students. FCS is the 7<sup>th</sup> largest out of 180 school districts in Georgia. For 2019-20, we are home to 38 schools – 21 elementary, 10 middle, 6 high, and 1 college and career high school. By 2022, we will open 4 additional new schools, a large classroom addition to West Forsyth HS, and a new Academies for Creative Education (ACE) for our non-traditional programs. As one of the nation's top 11 fastest growing communities, Forsyth County's growth and increasing diversity have had a positive impact on our schools. Highly motivated students come to our classrooms locally and from all over the world, representing 124 countries and 52 languages. The fastest-growing population is Asian students at 23%; the student population is also comprised of White 55%, Hispanic 14%, Black or African American 4%, Two or more races 3%, American Indian or Alaska Native and Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, which are both under 1%.

## Graduation Requirements

High school students are evaluated using a report card with numeric averages from 0 - 100. Students must meet diploma requirements in three areas:

1. **Assessments:** All students take the Georgia Milestones End of Course (EOC) assessments in 9<sup>th</sup> grade Language Arts, American Literature, Algebra, Geometry, United States History, Economics, Physical Science, and Biology. These students must pass the course to meet graduation requirements.
2. **Courses:** Students must complete and pass specific EOC course requirements as outlined by the graduation rule.
3. **Credits:** Students must earn 23 units as a minimum state requirement for graduation.
