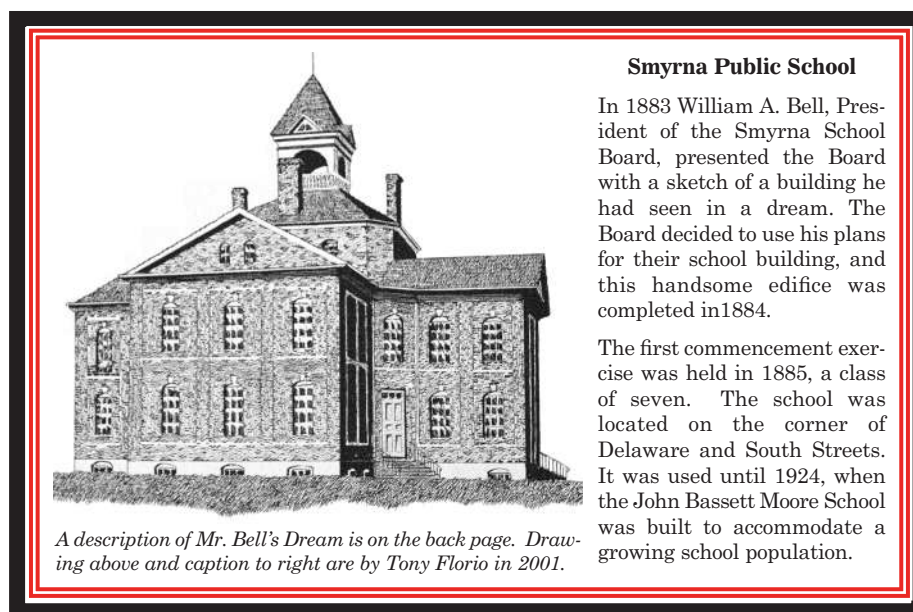

Fall Message from Deborah D. Wicks



Smyrna Public School

In 1883 William A. Bell, President of the Smyrna School Board, presented the Board with a sketch of a building he had seen in a dream. The Board decided to use his plans for their school building, and this handsome edifice was completed in 1884.

The first commencement exercise was held in 1885, a class of seven. The school was located on the corner of Delaware and South Streets. It was used until 1924, when the John Bassett Moore School was built to accommodate a growing school population.

A description of Mr. Bell's Dream is on the back page. Drawing above and caption to right are by Tony Florio in 2001.

The 2013-2014 school year will be an exciting one as we will proudly celebrate 130 years of Smyrna High School graduations with the class of 2014. With the first class graduating in 1885, the Smyrna School District has had a long history of educating thousands of students in a successful and positive manner. (See picture insert.) The October 18, 2013 Homecoming Parade will echo the celebration theme as well as the actual 130th graduation ceremony on May 31, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. Another of the celebrations to honor this special occasion will be held on Saturday, February 22, 2014 at "I Love the Smyrna School District" day. Moving from the very old to the very new

the Smyrna School District has a beautiful modern website custom designed by Educational Networks with the expert advice of a district committee of staff from all buildings. This was created so all of our buildings would have a consistent platform to communicate by. While the website is still a work in progress, webmasters from each building are continuously loading information. Currently, information available includes the District Calendar for 2013-2014, the new Child Nutrition Menu (which will also be given to all students the first week of school), and Smyrna Eagles athletic information. 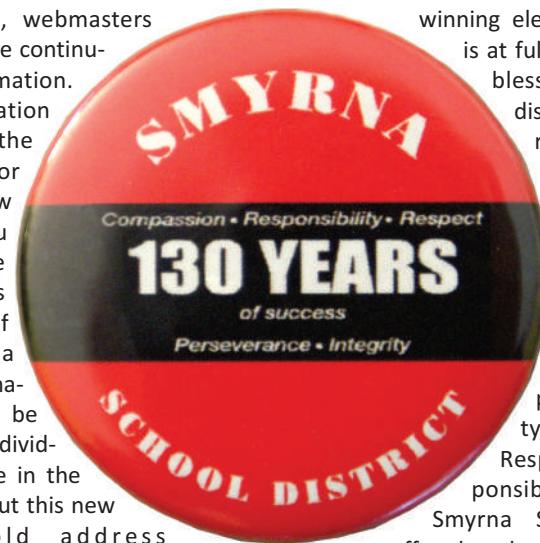
Over the summer months a "Needs Assessment" for five of our oldest buildings has taken place using Fearn and Clendaniel Architects. One of the needs identified was large failing roofs. With the help of our legislators, Senator Bruce Ennis and Representative William Carson, the Joint Finance Committee allowed our school district to move extra money from the now completed Clayton Intermediate School to a fund to be used for emergency roofing work. This will allow us to go out to bid in January for much needed roof repairs at Smyrna Elementary, John Bassett Moore Intermediate School, and the Thomas D. Clayton School. A special thank you to the co-chairs Senator Robert Venables and Representative Quinton Johnson for their help in working closely with Senator Ennis and Representative Carson. After the roofing issues, other building needs will be reviewed by with the Department of Education, to see if they meet the state's funding requirements. Results of this review will be made public soon.

Also, this summer with the financial help of our legislators Senator Ennis, Rep. Carson, Sen. David Lawson, Rep. Jeff Spiegelman, Rep. Rebecca Walker, plus Rep. Bethany Hall Long, and Sen. Brian Bushweller, our parking issues at Sunnyside Elementary School will be resolved now that this award

winning elementary school is at full capacity. How blessed our school district is that this remarkable group gives us such wonderful support.

The Smyrna/Clayton Community Core Values of Compassion, Integrity, Perseverance, Respect, and Responsibility are the Smyrna School District staff and students guiding lights.

Welcome back to the start of a new school year at Smyrna Elementary School. The School Nurse, Cafeteria Manager, and Transportation Supervisor will also be available to answer questions. This is an opportunity to introduce yourself and familiarize your child with the new classroom and grade level expectations. Teacher’s will not be available for parent-teacher conferences, but will work with you to schedule a meeting for a later time, if needed.

Our younger learners (KN and First Grade) are invited to visit their classroom on Friday, August 23, from 10:00 a.m. through 12:00 p.m. The purpose of this visit is to help our students transition to the school year by having an opportunity to meet their teacher and see their classroom. This is an informal visit with no set timeline, although we do ask that all visitors exit the building by 12:00 p.m. Our teachers will still have a lot to do to prepare for the first day of school.

An adults-only Open House will be held for parents of Kindergarten and First Grade students on Monday, September 16, at 6:00 p.m. We encourage you to attend this informational evening. Please join us in the gymnasium at 6:00 p.m. for opening remarks from building and district-level administration and staff. General classroom sessions will follow with your child’s teacher. Please do not hesitate to call the school regarding questions that arise before September 16.

Before and After School Care

In order to accommodate parent work schedules the Smyrna School District offers a program called “The Breakfast Club.” Beginning at 7:00 am prior to the start of each school day, breakfast and before school care will be available at a cost of \$2.50 per day (a monthly pre-payment will be required). If interested in this service, registration forms may be obtained in our front office, or, escort your child to our cafeteria the first day of school for registration and payment. All students who would like to participate in this program will enter the building at the Northeastern stairwell. This stairwell faces the Opera House and the Smyrna Public Library. All student participants must be escorted into the building’s cafeteria and signed-in by a parent/guardian on a daily basis.

This program will feature books for reading, writing experiences, educational games, cultural and arts enrichment, outdoor/indoor recreation, homework help, and group tutoring to extend learning. Student Involvement in School Activities

Studies show that when students become involved in school activities such as clubs, sports, SGA, FCCLA, FFA, FEA, BPA and other school organizations, they have more academic success than students who do not get involved in school activities. Student Attire & Electronic Devices Impact the Academic Climate at SHS

Proper attire in the business world requires a certain standard of dress. The Smyrna High School Dress Code reflects the community desire to prepare our students for the work force they will enter shortly. Parents and students should keep this dress code in mind when shopping for school clothing. Clothing worn to school should not interfere with the educational process.

Tops that suggest inappropriate messages or display pictures such as tobacco, drugs, alcohol, hate messages, expose the midriff or undergarments, halter-tops, fish-net tops, tank tops, and muscle shirts are not be worn to school. Oversized pants that sag below the waist or drag on the floor, and pants that are extremely tight are not be worn to school. Pajamas and clothing articles that replicate undergarments are not be worn to school. Shorts, skirts, and dresses should not be worn if the proper length is in violation of the Dress Code.

Hats, headbands, bandanas, earmuffs, goggles, and any other head coverings (unless required for religious purposes) are not permitted in school.

NEW for 2014: Use of Personally Owned Electronic Devices

As new technologies continue to change the world in which we live, they also provide many new and positive educational benefits for classroom instruction. To encourage educational growth, students at Smyrna High School may now bring their own mobile device to campus subject to the following guidelines and expectations.

Personally owned portable electronic equipment includes smart phones, or other portable devices (i.e. MP3 Player, electronic book, tablet, etc) that can be used for word processing, wireless Internet access, and information transmitting/receiving/storing, etc.) The district will not provide any wireless or Ethernet connections, furthermore connecting to the state network is a violation of the acceptable use policy. Students are free to use the internet via their personally owned device and data plan. Hot Spots or mobile wireless access points are not allowed.

Parking Policy & Traffic Flow

The Administration of Smyrna High School eagerly awaits the arrival of students for the 2013-2014 school year. The east side of the building (Smyrna Side) is designated for student parking only. Students who wish to drive to school will present their completed Application for Driving Permit with all supporting documents to Mrs. Watts in the front office, along with the \$10 parking fee beginning on August 19, 2013. Only students that have completed their six month restricted driving process may purchase parking tags. Parking spots may not be reserved at any time. Students in a Senior homeroom are permitted to purchase their parking tags starting on August 19, from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm, or on August 20, from 11:00 am – 3:00 pm. Students in a Junior homeroom who earned a PL 3 or PL 4 on the Spring DCAS during the 2012/13 school year may purchase their parking tags beginning on August 21, from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm. All students in Junior homerooms may purchase parking passes on August 22, from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm. The last day for purchasing a parking tag before the beginning of school will be on August 23, from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm. All cars using the school parking lot must display the tag on the rear view mirror

and park facing the building. Any car in the school parking lot that does not display the tag by the start of school on August 27, will be subject to towing.

It is the position of the Smyrna High School Administration that driving to school is a privilege, tied to the Code of Conduct. Students who violate the Code of Conduct will have their driving privilege revoked. The Administration urges the students and parents to become familiar with the regulations associated with the driving privilege as indicated on the Application for Driving Permit.

When entering the property between the hours of 7:00-7:30 am, and 2:15-2:45 pm all traffic must enter using the West side (Clayton Side entrance) and exit the property using the East side (Smyrna side exit). Please be mindful of the 5 MPH speed limit and yield to pedestrians crossing on their way to the building. No vehicles are permitted to park in the bus lane or to drop off or pick up students when the buses are present in front of the building. The parent drop off is located on the Smyrna side of the building next to the entrance to the Auditorium lobby. Please follow the driving directions provided by the signs, cones, and school personnel in that area when dropping off a student in the morning.

besides a very convenient center room which can be used for many other purposes. In the tower or steeple may be located a clock and an alarm or call bell. Mr. Bell estimates the cost of such a build-ing at about \$12,000. The four wings, he thinks, can be erected at a cost of a-bout \$1,500 each. The roof should be either of slate or tin and the passageway leading to the upper stories of galvanized iron, while the floor of the center building or rotunda might be laid with cement, laid off in ornamental style thus making the whole building entirely fire-proof. Such a building erected in the center of a two acre lot, conspicuously located and ornamented with shade and evergreen trees would certainly engender a feeling of pride in the breast of every citizen, and prove to be one of the handsome ornaments and attractions of the town.

The Delaware Interscholastic Athletic Association (DIAA) awards Middle and High Schools the Sportsmanship this award after a school has met each of the ten requirements. The DIAA requires that the school create a portfolio, hold events, and involve the entire school community. Also, the DIAA Sportsmanship Committee seeks out feedback from members of the media and the officials associations.

NOTICE OF FERPA RIGHTS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age the following rights:

Inspection

You may inspect the student's education records within 45 days of the day the District receives a request for access. You should submit to the Principal a written request identifying the record(s) you wish to inspect. The Principal will notify you of the time and place of inspection.

Amendment

If you believe education records are inaccurate, you may request the records be amended. Such a request must be in writing, and directed to the Principal. The request must identify the part of the record you want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate. If the District denies your request, the District will notify you of the decision, advise of the right to a hearing, and provide the hearing procedures.

Consent

You have the right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without

consent. One exception permits disclosure without consent to school officials with legitimate educational interests. School officials include District employees, Board members, a person or company retained by the District to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist), or a parent or student serving on a committee or assisting another school official. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the District will disclose education records without consent to officials of another district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

Complaint

You may file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA are:

A PARENT’S RIGHT TO KNOW

Under the **No Child Left Behind Act** a parent has the right to know the following information:

- » The qualifications of the school staff providing instruction to their child.
- » Their child's level of achievement in each state academic assessment.
- » Whether their child has been assigned to or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher of a core academic subject who is not highly qualified.

Upon the parents request the school is to provide the following information:

- » Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- » Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- » The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any graduate certification or degree held by the teacher and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- » Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and if so their qualifications.

The following letter will provide details on how parents may easily access information regarding their child's teacher(s).

Dear Parent:

As a parent of a student in the Smyrna School District you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask

for certain information about your child’s classroom teachers, and requires us to give you the information in a timely manner if you ask for it. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child’s classroom teachers:

- » Whether the Delaware Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- » Whether the Delaware Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- » The teacher’s college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- » Whether any teachers’ aides or similar paraprofessionals provide Title I services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Click “Search” for an employed Delaware public / charter school educator.” Enter the last name of your child’s teacher and click “search.” Click the “profile” link after your child’s teacher’s name. You will find the teacher’s certification under “credentials” and college major under “qualification.”

1.0 Programs Covered by the Complaint Process

This complaint process shall apply to the following programs: Title I Part A Improving Basic Programs Operated by Local Education Agencies; Title I Part B-1 Reading First; Title I Part B-2 Early Reading First; Title I Part B-3 William F. Goodling Even Start Family Literacy Program; Title I Part C Education of Migratory Children; Title I Part D Prevention and Intervention Programs for Children and Youth Who are Neglected, Delinquent, or at Risk; Title I Part F Comprehensive School Reform; Title I Part G Advanced Placement; Title II Part A Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Fund, Grants to States; Title II Part A-5-2151(B) School Leadership; Title II Part D 1 and 2 Enhancing Education Through Technology; Title III Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Immigrant Students; Title IV Part A Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities; Title IV Part B 21st Century Community Learning Centers; Title V Part A Innovative Programs and Title V Part B-1 Public Charter Schools.

2.0 Right to File a Complaint

An organization or an individual may file a complaint regarding an alleged violation of Federal Program Statutes or regulations by the Delaware Department of Education or the Local Education Agency. For purposes of this regulation, a Local Education Agency shall also include charter schools. A written and signed complaint shall be filed with the Delaware Department of Education.

- 2.1 The complaint shall include a statement specifying the alleged violation by the State Education Agency or a Local Education Agency. Such statement shall include facts and documentation of the alleged violation.
- 2.2 The Delaware Department of Education shall investigate the complaint and issue a written report including findings of fact and a decision to the parties included in the complaint within sixty (60) working days of the receipt of the complaint. An extension of the time limit may be made by the Delaware Department of Education only if exceptional circumstances exist with respect to a particular complaint.
- 2.3 The Delaware Department of Education may conduct an independent onsite investigation of the complaint, if it is determined that an on site investigation is necessary.
- 2.4 The complaint shall allege a violation that occurred not more than one (1) year prior to the date that the complaint is received.

3.0 Complaint Made to the Local Education Agency

An organization or an individual is encouraged to file a written, signed complaint with the Local Education Agency, prior to submission of the complaint to the Delaware Department of Education, concerning an alleged violation by the Local Education Agency of a Federal statute or regulation that applies to the Local Education Agency’s program.

- 3.1 The complaint shall include a statement specifying the alleged violation by the Local Education Agency. Such statement shall include facts and documentation of the alleged violation.
- 3.2 The superintendent or the agency head of the Local Education Agency shall investigate the complaint and issue a written report including findings of fact and a decision to the parties involved in the complaint within sixty (60) working days of the receipt of the complaint,

- 3.3 An appeal of the Local Education Agency decision may be made by the complainant to the Delaware Department of Education. The appeal shall be in writing and signed by the individual or by an individual representative of the organization making the appeal. The Delaware Department of Education shall resolve the appeal in the same manner as a complaint, as indicated in 2.0.

4.0 Review of Final Decision by the U.S. Department of Education

Any party to the complaint has the right to request that the Secretary, U. S. Department of Education, review the final decision of the Delaware Department of Education. The request for an appeal of the decision to the Secretary, U. S. Department of Education, shall be made in writing to the Delaware Department of Education within sixty days of the receipt of the decision.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS UNDER THE PROTECTION
OF PUPIL RIGHTS AMENDMENT (PPRA)

The Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment affords parents, students who are 18, and emancipated minors the following rights regarding the District’s conduct of surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and certain physical exams.

Protected Information Surveys
The District is required to obtain consent permitting your child to participate in certain school activities, or you may elect to opt out of such activities. These activities, known as protected information surveys, include a student survey, analysis, or evaluation concerning one or more of the following:

1. Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student’s parents;
2. Mental or psychological problems of the student or student’s family;
3. Sexual behavior or attitudes;
4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
5. Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
6. Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
7. Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents; or
8. Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

Notice & Opportunity To Opt Out
At the start of each school year, the District will notify you of dates of the following activities, and provide an opportunity to opt a student out of participating in such activities:

1. Any protected information survey, regardless of funding

source;

2. Any non-emergency, in-vasive physical exam or screening required as a condition of attendance, administered by the school or its agent, and not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of a student, except for hearing, vision, or scoliosis screenings, or any physical exam or screening permitted or required under Sate law; and
3. Activities involving collection, disclosure, or use of personal information ob-tained from students for marketing, or to sell or otherwise distribute the information to others.

Inspection

You may, upon request, inspect the following:

1. Protected information surveys of students;
2. Instruments used to collect personal information from students for marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes; and
3. Instructional materials used as part of the educational curriculum.

Adoption of Policy
The District will adopt policies, in consultation with parents, regarding these rights, as well as arrangements to protect student privacy in the administration of protected surveys and the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes. The District will notify you of these policies at least annually at the start of each school year and after any substantive changes.

NONDISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF SEX
(Compliance Violation Grievance Procedure)

Any student or employee of the Smyrna School District shall have the right to file a formal complaint alleging noncompliance with regulations outlined in Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 or in

Level One – Principal or immediate supervisor (informal)

A student with a complaint of sex discrimination shall discuss it with the teacher, counselor, or principal.

Level Two – Title IX Compliance Officer

If the grievance is not resolved at level one and the student wishes to pursue the grievance, the student may formalize the grievance by filing a complaint in writing on a Compliance Violation Form, which can be obtained from the Title IX compliance officer. The complaint shall state the nature of the grievance and the remedy requested. The filing of the formal written complaint at Level Two must be within 21 days from the date of the event giving rise to the grievance, or from the date the grievant could reasonably become aware of such occurrence. The grievant may request that a meeting about the complaint be held with the Title IX compliance officer. A minor student may be accompanied at that meeting by a parent or guardian. The Title IX compliance officer shall investigate.

the complaint and attempt to resolve it. A written report from the compliance officer about action taken will be sent to the grievant with 21 days after receipt of the complaint.

Level Three – Superintendent

If the complaint is not resolved at Level Two, the grievant may proceed to Level Three by presenting a written appeal to the Superintendent within 15 days after the grievant received the report from the compliance officer. A decision will be rendered and conveyed to the grievant by the Superintendent or his/her designee within 15 days after receipt of written appeal.

Level Four – Other agencies

The grievant may file formal complaints with the Delaware Civil Rights Commission or other agencies available for mediation or rectification of affirmative action grievances, or may seek private counsel for complaints alleging discrimination.

Note: The District appoints compliance coordinators for Title IX, Title VII and for Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as required by law. These compliance coordinators serve as grievance officers and are responsible for the District’s efforts to comply with nondiscrimination requirements under Title IX, Title VII, and Section 504.

A Description of Mr. Bell’s Dream in 1883

Wm. M. Bell, President of the School Board, notwithstanding his time and inclination is mostly devoted to financial matters, takes a lively interest in the education of the children of the town. On Friday night, after the meeting of tax payers that was held at the school house of districts No. 5 and 77, for the purpose of deciding on the construction of a new and more commodious building, one that will accommodate all the children of the town and more too. Mr. Bell, while lying in bed the same night, conceived one of the most original and complete plans of a building adapted for the purpose, which we will attempt to describe. The building consists of four wings, say 26x40 feet, two stories, with windows on the sides and ends, the ends of each wing to join an octagon shaped room or rotunda that will run to the top of the four wings and be capped with a steeple, tower or dome. There are four entrances to the rotunda, for the children, where they can go out of the weather and dispose of their wraps before entering their school-room. From

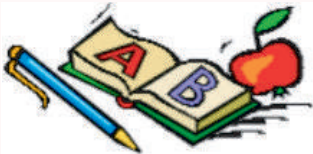
the rotunda each of the school rooms is entered on the first floor. To gain access to the rooms on the second floor, a passageway will have to be constructed all the way around the octagon shaped room and stairways leading thereto, erected diagonally, so that ready ingress and egress may be had to each room. These rooms will be entered from the passageway. Closets for the wraps of the children can be arranged on each side of the door entrance to the school rooms where they can be left before entering the rooms. An excavation need only be made under the rotunda for a furnace, can be arranged for heating comfortably every room in the whole building. At the top of the octagon, a center room can be arranged -- very airy and well lighted, which may be used as an observatory or a room for the meetings of the board of school directors. Here then, would be eight large, well-lighted and well ventilated rooms, easy of ingress and egress in case of fire, with a seating capacity of about 500 pupils,
