Bartram Trail High School serves as a center for academic excellence, community involvement and character development, while fostering a joy for lifelong learning.

Established in 2000, Bartram Trail High School (BTHS) is a public high school located in northwest St. Johns County, Florida. As a member of the St. Johns County School District, BTHS is a high performance school consistently recognized by the State of Florida for academic excellence and by *Newsweek* and *The Washington Post* as one of the best schools in the nation. BTHS offers students the VyStar Academy of Business & Finance and the Academy of Design & Construction. The Design Academy features Architecture, Interior Design, and Fashion Design. BTHS offers Advanced Placement courses, Air Force ROTC, Dual Enrollment, and the AVID College Prep program.

Established in 1821, St. Johns County is primarily a residential area best known for its county seat of St. Augustine. The county's economic industry is tourism. Visitors and residents frequent the historical landmarks, beaches, parks, and golf courses sprinkled alongside the many miles of accessible waterways offered by the St. Johns River and the Atlantic Ocean. Higher education is readily available to residents through private and state colleges located in the county and through the University of North Florida located in Jacksonville, FL. St. Johns County is part of the Jacksonville Metropolitan Statistical Area that also includes Duval, Clay, Nassau, and Baker counties. The residents of this Metropolitan area are influenced by endeavors of the Arts, Agriculture, History, Recreation, Business & Industry, and suburban, rural, and city life. Student enrollment at BTHS is 2323 students for the 2016-2017 school year.

CURRICULUM AND REQUIREMENTS

Each BTHS student has the opportunity to take seven courses each year on a traditional schedule of seven, 45-minute periods each day. Students may complete additional coursework for credit through Florida Virtual School. BTHS requires students to meet the State of Florida credit, grade point average, and testing requirements to earn a standard high school diploma. Dual Enrollment

Bartram Trail High School students who meet the required academic and college testing criteria are eligible to enroll in college courses at St. Johns River State College and earn high school credit while earning college credit. BTHS students can choose from many academic and elective courses to satisfy high school requirements. Considered academically rigorous courses, Dual Enrollment courses that earn high school credit are granted one additional value point in the weighted grade point average per high school credit earned.
