#### Title I...

- Is a provision of NCLB to ensure federal support for students who show need for it in critical areas of instruction.
- Is funded by federal government.
- Supports an extension teacher to work with designated students for *extra* support in content areas (math, reading, LA, science, social studies) outside the regular classroom.
- Provides additional support materials for students and families
- Funds the provision of a parent liaison to enable parents to have the greatest possible involvement in their child's education.

# What is Title I?... In A Nutshell

Title I, Part A provides federal dollars to help supplement educational opportunities for children who live in high poverty areas who are most at risk of failing to meet state's challenging achievement standards.

### Parental Involvement

ESEA defines parental involvement as the participation of parents in regular, two way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities.

- Programs, activities, and procedures must be planned and implemented with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.
- Title I schools must consult with parents annually to determine how to spend PI funds to enhance the school's educational goals.
- Parental involvement activities in a SWP/TA should target the particular academic needs of the parents of the lowest achieving students so that they may better assist in the education of their children.

Parent/Guardian,

If your issue has been resolved the process is complete.

Parent/Guardian may appeal to the appropriate District administrator, if not satisfied with proposed resolution.

#### Clayton County Public Schools Complaint Resolution Process

#### FINAL APPEAL:

Should the parent/staff member appeal the decision of the cabinet-level administrator, the Superintendent will review the case file.

The Superintendent will issue a final decision regarding the appeal, and a meeting will only be scheduled with the parent/guardian at the Superintendent's direction.

- 1. Using Board Policy, Rules and Georgia Education Code, administrators will assess new information presented during conference with the parent.
- 2. It is the goal of CCPS to work with parents and staff to resolve all concerns and/or complaints at the school or department site. The District will always refer parents and staff to the principal or director as a first attempt to resolve the issue.
- 3. A cabinet-level administrator will evaluate the process/legality of the original decision. This is the final meeting with parent.
