AVID News

AVID Corner-August/September 2016

Aloha Mokulele Ohana,

This month's AVID corner describes in part the journey we are taking this year as we continue to implement the four AVID pillars: Instruction, Culture, Leadership, and Systems. We are now into our fourth year of AVID Elementary, and look forward with anticipation to another wonderful chapter. Three mantras which permeate the entire AVID structure are "Slow and Steady, Slow and Sequential, and Slow and Solid." The common adjective in these is 'Slow.' This has now become a school wide mantra as we continue our journey towards excellence in the way we do school. We take baby steps until the practice becomes internalized, then add more a little at a time. A child first crawls, then stands, then walks, then eventually runs. By small and simple things, great things are brought about over time with persistence as well as consistency. In this manner, all the AVID components at the elementary level will be put in place until they become systematic.

Upon reflection, that is how we have been implementing AVID from the very beginning; slowly. Just like the mighty oak tree has small beginnings in a tiny acorn, so we have had small beginnings with AVID at the elementary school level. We are now at the sapling stage. We started with the DOT (Daily Organizational Tool) binder to help our students organize their materials, homework, planners, and communication logs. In the second year of AVID implementation we added note taking in 2 and 3 columns. Then last year we added reflection logs. This summer a team of our teachers attended the AVID Summer Institute at the Hawaii Convention Center. They will be sharing another AVID component that we will focus on this year while maintaining the practices we already have in place. We will share this addition in the next AVID Corner.

While we progress along our AVID journey we have to justify our existence at every turn. The AVID certification process is challenging and rigorous. We have to document everything and collect evidence of every aspect of the program throughout the year. This must be submitted in an evidence binder in May of each year. We collect evidence as we conduct classroom walkthroughs, capture photos of various components, and observe AVID implementation at the classroom level. At the same time we continue to showcase our students who show great promise in AVID by the way they behave in the classroom. Each month one student in each class is selected as the AVID student of the month to be honored in the VIP lunch with the Principal. This is the student that in the teacher's estimation has best exemplified the characteristics of a good AVID student.

As one great leader stated "That which we persist in doing becomes easier; not that the nature of the thing changes, but that our power to do it increases."

Anticipating an awesome AVID journey this school year!


Mokulele Elementary School is a Tribes school where all learners succeed in a safe, positive place that values relationships and relevant learning.
