## **Principal's Message**

Aloha Mokulele Elementary 'Ohana,

We are now in the middle of SBA testing. These mandatory statewide assessments are rigorous and demanding for our students in grades 3-6, and truly test their ability to perform multiple tasks, think deeply, and reason well. Therefore, they need all their focus and full alertness for each section of the tests in order to perform favorably. As parents you can assist them to be in a better position to do so by ensuring that they receive a good night's rest with sufficient sleep followed by a healthy breakfast.

Since April is the Month of the Military Child, we had many wonderful activities this month focusing on our military connected students. Although 96% of our student body are military dependents, all of our students participated in these activities. April 13 was Purple Up Day, and it was a delight to see the sea of purple on campus as we honored all branches of the armed forces. All students created stars with written messages thanking our military servicemen and women for the services. EA Janna Arakaki created a Heroes banner out of the stars, which she posted on the stage. Each grade level received 30 minutes of extra playtime with members of our military partners, the 13<sup>th</sup> OWS, followed by ice pop treats. Special thanks to Mrs. Adele Tomoyasu-Oumi, our MFLC for planning and coordinating these fun events.

To further address the challenges associated with frequent transitions in the lives of our students, we are very grateful to receive support for the Trevor Romain Anchored 4Life program. Six of our grade 4-6 students received training on April 10 and 11. They are now trained as student leaders to assist students in transition to and from Mokulele. We are also thankful for the many materials that the program provides for our needy students to help them develop resiliency to change.

## Kindergarten:

Wow, the school year is rapidly coming to an end! Mr. Charles King the "Reptile Man" will be visiting Mokulele on May 5<sup>th</sup> with lots of different native animals for kindergarteners to touch. Kindergartners plan to celebrate the end of school with a read-a-thon and an in class promotion ceremony. More details about these events will be sent home with your child at the end of May. Thanks for a wonderful school year, please continue reading with your child over the summer.

### Grade 1:

First graders are heading into the last month of the school year. The students need to remember to continue to put effort into all their work. One exciting activity we will be completing is the recycle car project testing how far the car can travel. Then we will be speeding into the lazy days of summer and reading lots of books.

### Grade 2

Grade 2 Students have been studying about the scientific process and exploring. We are using the scientific process: Investigate, Hypothesize, Predict, Conclude in our readings in our textbook about Space/Astronauts and Earth Day/Conserving Natural Resources.





#### Grade 4:

Fourth Graders are rounding the corner and coming up to the home stretch.... It's been a swell ride this year but the fun isn't over just yet!! The fourth graders are looking forward to taking our 2 final field trips of the year. April 27 we are going to visit Keiki 'O Ka 'Aina for a refresher in Hawaiiana and May 3 we will be visiting Windward Community College's Imaginarium for some Science Fun! As we near the end we also find ourselves up against our biggest challenge... SBAC testing. May 1 - 5 (except for Wednesday, the 3rd) we will be taking our SBAC tests in Language Arts and Math. On May 9 we will also be taking our final HSA Science test. Please be sure that our Fourth Graders are prepared for these tests by having them sleep early the night before, eat a healthy breakfast, be in school on time, and sending them lots of love and encouragement like you do everyday! Since our students will be working hard in the morning on their tests (5/1 - 5/5) we have a fun surprise for them in the afternoons... Bike Education. The Hawaii Bicycle League will be here to teach our students how to safely ride a bike. Bikes and helmets will be provided. See additional forms being sent home on April 26. We can't believe how fast this year has been! We look forward to a fun filled final weeks of school!

**Grade 5:** The 5th Graders created mathematics videos using their geometric terms and wrote research papers relating to phenomenons in our solar system.

**Grade 6:** The school year is coming to a close very quickly. Our students have completed the Standards Based Assessments (SBA) and are continuing to finish up with the ELA and social studies curriculum. As a final writing piece, they reminisced about their years of growth, experiences, and fond memories in elementary school. As for social studies, the students have been learning about Greek history with the focus on geography, trade, and comparisons between Sparta and Athens. We will be on our way to Rome soon. 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#### Vision


Mokulele Elementary School is a Tribes school where all learners succeed in a safe, positive place that values relationships and relevant learning.
