Dear Parents,

I am pleased to report that Sequoyah High School has been designated an "A School" by the Georgia Department Of Education. In addition, the Governor's Office Of Student Achievement has awarded Sequoyah HS the Greatest Gain Award for having a three year College and Career Ready Index CCRPI Progress Score that is ranked in at least the 93rd percentile. SHS was the only Cherokee County High school to be receive this recognition.

As we begin the new year, we are beginning to utilize Sequoyah East classrooms. We have assigned 12 teachers, an assistant principal, and a secretary in S. East for this semester. In addition, we have increased student passing time between classes from 4 minutes to 6 minutes. We have also begun the 2017-18 scheduling process. We are planning to have our annual 10th Grade Advisement Meetings for parents and their students in the media center on February 15 and 16 so that 10th grade parents and their students can jointly meet with their student's counselor and representatives from all departments to plan for 11th and 12th grade courses. Appointments for these meetings have been sent to parents. On Friday, February 16, we will send home with each 9th, 10th, and 11th grade student, a copy of the courses he/she has selected for the 2017-18 school year. If there are any problems, please indicate that on the form that is returned to the Homeroom teacher, because all course requests will be finalized and the master schedule will be developed. Please be aware of all of the courses that your student selects during the scheduling

process, as we will be unable to change courses that have been selected once the master schedule is developed and students are assigned into classes in March.

I would like to remind you of the school district's promotion policy. Student's are promoted to the next grade when they have accumulated the following units:

- End of 9th Grade 5 units: must include one unit of English, Math, and Science
- End of 10th Grade 11 units: must include two units of English and Math and one unit of Science
- End of 11th Grade 17 units: must include three units of English and Math, two units of Science, and one unit of Social Studies
- All students must earn 23 units to graduate

I know that this is early, but I also want to remind everyone that Final Exams for this semester for seniors will be during the week of May 15th and during the week of May 22nd for all other students. Final Exams are not given early. They are administered on the day they are scheduled on the exam calendar that will be disseminated in May. Students must be present for all exams. The only excuse for an absence that will be accepted during this time is a documented medical emergency.


Young Life and PE


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SHS AFIROTC Tribal Chant Input


Christmas Parades
