Grade Level News


Each month our Grade Level News will feature highlights about school life at Mokulele Elementary School. Enjoy finding out more about what happens at the Home of the Flyers.

Kindergarten: November is filled with holidays and different activities for the Kindergarteners. Mokulele's annual Fall Festival will be on Thursday, November 9th. We are looking for parent volunteers to help with the Kindergarten game booth. Look for more information in your child's homework folder. Students will also be working on their Native American vest. Finally, Mokulele will be having a Turkey Trot on Wednesday, November 22nd. Please continue to check your child's DOT Binder for information and upcoming events.

Grade 1:Say the chant. Tigers. Elephants. Hippo. Snake. Giraffe and Crocodile. Agargh!

The First Graders chose their animals for their second quarter Parent/Child project – Feathers, Fur, or Scales. Please work with your child in guiding and assisting them to produce a thoughtful product. We will also be examining plant and animal structures that help them with survival and look at which parts inspired humans to develop an invention. Then, we will set sail from Holland to Plymouth on the rough Atlantic Ocean to compare the life of a Pilgrim child to ourselves. Would you rather be a Pilgrim or a child today? Last, we will read about more mice. Leo Lionni will be our feature author/illustrator in the second quarter. He also has many mice characters and lessons for us to reflect on. Grade 2:Our 2nd Graders continue to be scientists studying BIOLOGY, the study of life. We continue to explore various life cycles of many different species: reptiles, insects, animals and mammals. We will also be learning about our skeletal system and our different bones.







Grade 3: Last month the students in Third Grade were issued a school-owned Lenovo Chromebook for use in the classroom. The teachers reviewed the Chromebook User Guidelines and now the students are able to use the computers to access Achieve 3000 (Kidbiz), Front Row Ed, the Accelerated Reader Program and more! The students are expected to show responsibility while caring and using their school issued Chromebook. The Third Graders attended the Honolulu Theatre for Youth performance of "The Ballad of Mu Lan" by Alvin Chan on September 29, 2017. The play featured traditional Japanese theatre elements and live music. This classic story teaches a powerful lesson about inner strength and standing up for one's self when faced with many challenges. It was a fun filled field trip that students will remember for a long time!

Grade 4: Fall Festival is right around the corner and we are still looking for donations of colored hair spray (blue, pink & purple are the popular colors). If you can help us out the fourth graders would greatly appreciate it. We are also looking for volunteers to help us run our fourth grade activities. Grade 5: To strengthen their learning of the solar system, the 5th Graders are visiting Bishop Museum's Planetarium later this month.

Grade 6: Happy Turkey Month. We all cannot wait to eat special holiday treats soon. Football and shopping are also on our minds, but there is still so much to do. The sixth graders are continuing to learn about ancient civilizations. We studied Ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia. We plan to add Ancient China, Greece and Rome too. Ancient cultures all had a specific way of communicating in written forms, we have learned. They all had rules/laws and a different ways to govern their people. The religions of these civilizations are unique and differ from present day but are still extremely interesting. Vision


Mokulele Elementary School is a Tribes school where all learners succeed in a safe, positive place that values relationships and relevant learning.




Mokulele is Recycling For a Cause
