

- Registering for the appropriate high school courses can effect graduation requirements, the three Honors Certificates, admission to colleges, NCAA eligibility, and preparing for your career.
- Your high school grade point average (GPA) can affect eligibility to participate in high school co-curricular activities, awards such as the Honor Roll and Principal's list, as well as effect admission to colleges, eligibility for scholarships and eligibility to participate in college athletics

Tips for Success from the Counseling Department

Things you can do **NOW** to prepare for life after high school:

- 1. PCHS daily bulletin (also available on our school website: www.pchs.k12.hi.us) There is a College & Career section under the "Academics" button
- 2. Earn above average grades (e.g., UH Manoa requires a 2.8 G PA)
- 3. Participate in school and/or community activities -- start a resume/personal data sheet
- 4. Research college admission requirements and education/work skills needed for different careers—it's never too early!
- 5. Speak to a counselor to help with your planning and regularly visit the PCHS College & Career Center, room C103
- 6. Attend activities like college and career field trips, guest speakers, workshops, college fairs, etc.
- 7. Keep a portfolio of your honors, awards, certificates, medals, projects, test scores, etc. so that you have a record for your resume (update annually)
