Geographic Exceptions (GE)

- Submit completed GEs to Highlands Intermediate – they will forward to PCHS
- Deadline to submit is March 1, 2018
- GE decisions should be mailed out no later than April 30, 2018
- If your GE is approved, please call the Registrar's Office to inform us of your intentions ASAP

Freshman Orientation

- First day of the school year – incoming 9th graders only (August 6, 2018)

- Students attend all 7 periods on a very short schedule

Bus Transportation

- Must reside in the PCHS district – students on GE not eligible for school bus service
- Student must reside 1.5 miles+ from the school to qualify for school bus service
- Applications are available online or at your school
- Submit completed application form to PCHS office
- Do not attach your payment to the application form – payments only accepted after application is approved by PCHS

Lunch Deposits/Free & Reduced Lunch

- Deposits made in the front office before 8:30 a.m. for use on the same day
- Cash, money order or cashier's checks are accepted; payment receipts are provided for each lunch deposit
- Free & Reduced Lunch application is available on line or in the office - applications must be completed before the middle of September
- One application per household

ID Badges

- All students must have an ID on them at all times for safety reasons
- IDs used to obtain lunch, check out books and for identification purposes
- Replacement ID cost is \$5.00 each
- IDs can be picked up at the attendance office in the administration building

	Academy of Culinary Arts, Health Science & Leadership TPC7010 (Public & Human Services Pathway Core)	The Academy of Culinary Arts, Health Science, and Leadership houses the Culinary Arts, Health Science, and Leadership pathways. Have a knack for working with people? Enjoy collaboration and teamwork? You can serve your community and make a difference in people's lives by considering career opportunities in (1) culinary and hospitality, education, legal and protective services, or (2) through diagnostic and clinical health work, biotechnology medical research, and health and nutrition services.
	Academy of International Business & Design TAC2010 (Arts & Communication Pathway Core)	The Academy of International Business and Design houses the International Business/Virtual Enterprise, Graphic Design, Fashion Design, and Digital Media/Broadcasting pathways. The academy is intended for students interested in (1) learning about essential business concepts, how to establish and manage a small business, and/or understanding marketing and its role in the free enterprise system, and (2) learning concepts in Visual, Fashion, Graphic, Written, and Media arts. Students in the academy will have the opportunity to possibly earn industry level certifications in the various subject areas.
	Academy of Technology & Design TIC2010 (Industrial/Engineering Technology Pathway Core)	The Academy of Technology and Design houses the Building and Construction, Natural Resources, Engineering, Computer Science, and Robotics pathways. The academy is intended for students interested (1) in designing, engineering, developing, and building solutions to address society's problems and needs, or (2) in making the best use of natural resources in order to meet the basic needs of the world's population. Students in the academy will have the opportunity to (1) earn A+ certification through the Computer Science Pathway, (2) waive entry-level course requirements and earn placement into upper level CTE courses in the Hawaii community colleges through the Building & Construction Pathway, and (3) gain admittance as a freshmen into the University of Hawaii at Manoa College of Engineering through the Engineering Pathway.

*Student will be taking an online Health (HLE1000) course concurrently with this Freshman Seminar course.

- Registering for the appropriate high school courses can effect graduation requirements, the three Honors Certificates, admission to colleges, NCAA eligibility, and preparing for your career.
- Your high school grade point average (GPA) can affect eligibility to participate in high school co-curricular activities, awards such as the Honor Roll and Principal's list, as well as effect admission to colleges, eligibility for scholarships and eligibility to participate in college athletics

Tips for Success from the Counseling Department

Things you can do **NOW** to prepare for life after high school:

1. PCHS daily bulletin (also available on our school website: www.pchs.k12.hi.us) There is a College & Career section under the "Academics" button
2. Earn above average grades (e.g., UH Manoa requires a 2.8 G PA)
3. Participate in school and/or community activities -- start a resume/personal data sheet
4. Research college admission requirements and education/work skills needed for different careers – it's never too early!
5. Speak to a counselor to help with your planning and regularly visit the PCHS College & Career Center, room C103
6. Attend activities like college and career field trips, guest speakers, workshops, college fairs, etc.
7. Keep a portfolio of your honors, awards, certificates, medals, projects, test scores, etc. so that you have a record for your resume (update annually)
