Class Layout, Policies, and Expectations for Middle School



WARM-UP: **Every class will begin with a warm-up that consists of either a drawing exercise or questions about the select art style and unit.**

These serve as a study guide for quizzes and for the final exam

Assignments are corrected together as a class and turned in each day!!

Each unit will last about a week. A quiz will be given on the last day of almost every unit. Projects will be due on the last day of the unit.

**Students who miss class need to take the initiative and ask what they have missed. It is the student's responsibility to make up warm-ups and quizzes. Projects may need to be altered or shortened due to excused absences as they can be difficult to complete at home.
