Each month our Grade Level News will feature highlights about school life at Mokulele Elementary School. Enjoy finding out more about what happens at the Home of the Flyers.

Kindergarten: The Kindergarteners had an awesome time at the Zoo! They saw many different animals and enjoyed petting the goats in the Keiki Zoo. Grade 2: Our 2nd Graders are learning many elements of art through biographies. They are learning about elements of art through the works of these famous artists: Vincent Van Gogh, Pablo Picasso and Rembrandt.




Mokulele Elementary School is a Tribes school where all learners succeed in a safe, positive place that values relationships and relevant learning.
