He is learning Braille, to use the braille writer and starting to type his letters. His favorite field trip was to Wicked R Ranch where he got to ride a horse, ride the train with his Grandmother and spend a beautiful day outside. ### ELI VOLCY- Ms. Leloux - 1st grade at Main Site

Eli is making tremendous progress in the area of communication. He now uses a communication device to make requests. He will also comment using descriptors and say hello and goodbye! Eli is also becoming more independent in the classroom; he will transition between activities with minimal prompts and can work independently for up to 10 minutes! Eli is a very bright student is making great progress in reading and math. He is currently testing out of Level 3 of the Early Literacy Skills Builder curriculum and will start Level 4 shortly. At the beginning of the school year, Eli was on Level 1! He can also receptively identify 40 sight words. In Math, Eli is able to count out manipulatives for a given number from 1-5 without using a ten-frame and can count out manipulatives from 6-10 with a ten-frame.
