

2018 Manufacturing Appreciation Week Student Design Competition

What is Manufacturing Appreciation Week? It's an annual event that recognizes the contribution of manufacturing to Georgia's economy. An important part of this event is the Student Design Competition, which involves children and teens in the celebration and teaches them about manufacturing.

What is the Student Design Competition? Students from across Georgia submit artwork depicting the importance of manufacturing to their lives and communities. From these submissions, three winners in each of three categories are chosen.

What are the three categories?

- Grades K-5
- Grades 6-8
- Grades 9-12

What exactly is "manufacturing"? Manufacturing is the process of creating physical objects that will be used by someone or used to build something else. Students should consider products made in their home towns, counties or statewide to feature Georgia products in their designs. Manufacturing provides approximately 334,000 jobs for Georgians. More than 9,952 manufacturing facilities in Georgia are devoted to making products as diverse as textiles and automotive parts.

Contest Rules:

- 1. All artwork must include the following information on the back, upper-right corner:
- Student's name
- Student's grade level
- School's name
- School's phone number
 - 2. Artwork must be:
- 11"x 17"
- Landscape
 - 3. Art may be created with paint, watercolors, pencils, markers, crayons, charcoal, etc. Make sure art is completely dry before submitting! Art from grades 9-12 may be computer-generated.
 - 4. All artwork must be 2-D. Do not allow students to glue or paste 3-D objects to their art.
 - 5. Art should portray manufacturing specific to the state of Georgia.
 - 6. Art must be received at the district office by November 2, 2018.
 - 7. Submitted entries will not be returned to contestants.
 - 8. Award winners will be invited to the MODL Awards luncheon on December 5, 2018 to be formally recognized.
