Honors Spanish IV, although a natural continuation of Honors Spanish III and Spanish III, represents a transitional phase in which students might take true ownership over their language development. Students will learn actively while in class as well as with opportunities to explore beyond the classroom walls. Students will apply the language knowledge acquired during the first three years of Spanish and polish their abilities to listen, speak, read, and write in Spanish. In addition, students will learn to integrate these skills, reaching a high intermediate level by the end of the year. Students will fine-tune and grow in their vocabulary and grammar understanding as well as widen their literacy, communicative, and cultural skills. Whether students are preparing for the A.P. Spanish Language and Culture course next year, a college placement test or other standardized test, college courses in Spanish, or for travel and other interactions in Spanish, the information gained and the skills practiced and honed in Honors Spanish IV will definitely serve them well.

The **REQUIRED** summer preparation for learning assignment for 2018-2019 Honors Spanish IV students will include the following:

- A. Practice with the written accent mark in Spanish (pages 2 and 3)
- B. Verb tense review (pages 4 and 5)
- C. Writing practice which includes a **picture** of something significant observed this summer (pages 5—7)

The summer assignment is due at the beginning of your first day of class and will count as the first **Summative Assessment grade**. There are 200 points possible.

• Rule #1: For words that end in a vowel, the letter N or the letter S, the voice rises on the next to last syllable.

For example:

es-tu-di- <u>AN</u> -te	<u>PE</u> -rros	pro-fe- <u>SO</u> -ra	re- <u>Pi</u> -tan

 Rule #2: For words that end in all other consonants (not S or N), the voice rises on the *last* syllable.

For example:

bo-rra- <u>DOR</u>	re- <u>LOJ</u>	pa- <u>RED</u>	es-pa- <u>ÑOL</u>

• Rule #3: Words that do not obey the first two rules require a written accent mark to indicate the stressed syllable.

For example:
