## SCHOLARS DIPLOMA PATHWAY

  - Earn (1) credit in Statistics or equally rigorous mathematics course
  - Earn (1) credit in Chemistry or Physics
  - Earn (1) credit science course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
  - Earn (2) credits in the same foreign language
  - Earn (1) credit in Advance Placement, International Baccalaureate, an Advanced International Certificate of Education, Dual Enrollment course or an approved Industry Certification
  - *Class of 2016 & 2017: Passing score on FSA 10, Algebra 1 EOC, Biology EOC, and U.S. History EOC*

- *Class of 2018 & 2019: Passing score on FSA 10, Algebra 1 EOC, Biology EOC, U.S. History EOC, ELA II, Geometry EOC and Algebra 2 EOC*

## MERIT DIPLOMA PATHWAY

- Meet ALL requirements of the Standard Diploma and the following requirements:
  - Attain one or more Industry Certifications from the list established under S.1003.429 F.S.
  - *Industry Certification Courses which lead to college credit may be substantiated for up to two math credits and/or one science credit excluding Algebra 1, Geometry and Biology.*
  - *Testing requirements are the same as Standard Diploma*

## SCHOLARS WITH DISTINCTION DIPLOMA PATHWAY

- Meet ALL requirements of the SCHOLARS DIPLOMA PATHWAY and the following:
  - Cumulative Weighted Grade Point Average of 3.75 or higher
  - (3) Consecutive years in the same foreign language
  - (6) credits in AP or IB classes earning an "A" or "B" or (4) AP or IB and (2) Dual Enrollment courses
  - (1) Credit in Experimental Research or equivalent with a grade of "A" or "B" or (1) Extended Essay, Senior Portfolio or 4<sup>th</sup> year of World Language or (1) extra AP, IB or DE credit.
  - *Testing requirements are the same as the SCHOLARS DIPLOMA PATHWAY*

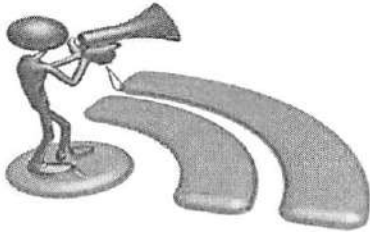
If you need to make up a failed course or complete your online learning graduation requirement, you may do so at [www.flvs.net](http://www.flvs.net). You will be required to set up a STUDENT and PARENT account in order to register

for a course. You will then select "Seminole County Virtual" as the District Franchise. Once your parent approves, an email will be sent to your counselor for approval. Once the course(s) is complete, your counselor will receive a copy of your grade to be entered onto your transcript. It is important that you focus and do well as Virtual School courses will contribute to your overall GPA.

# AVOIDING CREDIT DENIAL

Students who acquire 9 or more unexcused absences during a class, per semester will receive credit denial. To avoid this, please submit the required excused documentation to attendance within 5 days when you return to school. You are also encouraged to speak with your teachers to acquire any missed work to avoid falling behind in the course.

### COUNSELOR COMMUNICATION

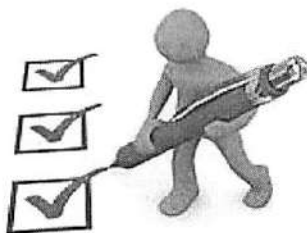

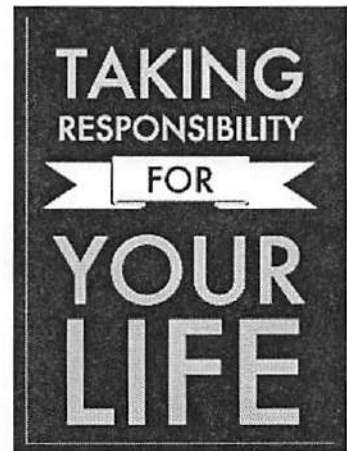


What is YOUR responsibility:
