Students and staff are constantly hand washing or sanitizing. If a student or staff member has been exposed to an individual that has a confirmed case of COVID and they were within 6 feet of that person for more than 15 minutes, we are asking them to quarantine for 14 days. Of course, people are going to get a cold, get the flu, have allergies, none of that has not changed. So just like in all years if a student or staff member is sick, we are asking that they stay home until they feel better.




Teacher Spotlight

Mrs. Davis - Science/Robotics Club


