



Joy Harjo (born May 9, 1951) is a poet, musician, playwright, and author. She is the incumbent <u>United States Poet Laureate</u>, the first <u>Native American</u> to hold that honor. Harjo is a member of the Muscogee Nation (Este Mvskokvlke) and belongs to Oce Vpofv (Hickory Ground).
