# Kindergarten

Happy October Families! We have continued to be busy in Kindergarten learning how to write our names, all about our five senses, how we can be a bucket filler (showing kindness to others), and about our different kinds of emotions.

We are still working on learning how to read and write, count and writing numbers 1-5, and we already know all about our 5 senses. We have continued to dive deeper into exploring our unit theme of "Who We Are". Please be sure to talk with your scholars each night to see what new and exciting things they have learned in all our subjects!

Remember to review and practice Sight Words with your child daily. We suggest they spend 15-20 minutes a night working on these words. The faster they learn their Sight Words, the faster they will be reading independently! Please also read with your child for about 15-20 minutes a night.

Lastly, please work on counting with them every day. Our end of the year goal is to have them be able to count to 100 by tens and ones.

### 1st Grade

The First-Grade teachers are so proud of our scholars They have adjusted well with the routinesthe routines that are customary for First Grade, as well as wearing masks, social distancing and using hand sanitizer several times a day. Our scholars have stepped up to the challenge of working hard and being good citizens.

In Reading, our scholars are learning how to retell stories in sequence and identifying the beginning, middle and end. They are identifying the characters and settings of story we read. These are skills that you can use when reading with your child at home.

In Math, our scholars have been working on math facts 0 to 10. They have been learning different strategies to find the sum or differences in math facts. Some of the strategies include- using a number line, using counters, and drawing a picture to solve math problems.

The First Grade Team would like to thank you for your support in filling out the many forms we send you, making sure your child has a mask on when arriving at school and being involved in your child's education. We are always available by phone or email if you have any concerns. Happy Fall!



# 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

Second grade scholars have started working on our second unit, How We Express Ourselves. In this unit we will discover how location, pattern and structure may shape how people express themselves. Some of the concepts included in this unit are geography, surface of the earth, weather patterns, culture and literature including fairytales and folktales. Scholars are encouraged to be communicators and share their family traditions and be open minded as we learn about new cultures and values.

In math, we are wrapping up place value of 2 and 3 digits. Scholars are practicing adding and subtracting 0-20 fluently as well as comparing 3-digit numbers. Place value and math fact fluency are crucial in understanding and solving word problems. You can help at home by practicing addition and subtraction flashcards or games.

Homework for second grade scholars includes reading and/or practicing sight words nightly. In addition, math review pages are sent home for scholars to practice. These pages do not need to be turned in.

Scholars should continue to wear their uniform and mask daily. Thank you for helping to keep us safe and healthy.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade

As we roll into fall, we are starting a new unit of inquiry - How to Express
Ourselves. Throughout this unit, scholars will be studying character traits in literature.

Scholars will inquire about how characters change throughout a story. They will also be looking at primary and secondary sources to learn the differences between them and to study important events that have happened in our country's history.

In math, scholars will be discussing place value and rounding. We will teach rounding using a vertical number line. This method has been very successful. Make sure you ask your scholar to teach you this easy way of rounding. We will also visit elapsed time and basic units of measurement.

Finally, in science, scholars will be describing the different properties of matter, such as texture, smell, and hardness. We have several hands-on activities planned for this fun unit. As always, if you have any questions or concerns about your child, please contact your child's teacher.



# 4th Grade

Happy October! The Fourth Grade team is so proud of all our scholars. We know that there have been a lot of changes, but the scholars have persevered and we are all getting into our daily routine.

Please remind your connect scholars to log into their google meets on time and be prepared. This will provide us more time for instruction.

We are beginning our second Unit of Inquiry. This unit is titled Where we are in Place and Time. In this unit scholars will learn about exploration and movement. We will learn about the oldest city in America, St. Augustine. We will also explore the Indigenous tribes of Florida. Scholars will also learn about the different types of energy and the movement of sound waves. Normally, during this unit, we take our annual 4<sup>th</sup> grade trip to St. Augustine, but due to restrictions we will not be able to visit at this time. We will however be providing virtual field trips for the scholars, so they can make connections with history. As always, please encourage your scholars to read every night and practice their multiplication facts. These are the building blocks of education. # 5<sup>th</sup> Grade

Fifth grade is finishing up "How We Organize Ourselves' unit, exploring the systems we have, how they are connected to functions in our society and everyone's responsibilities within these systems. The scholars have a greater understanding of rules and governing and how they are part of those systems. We will be moving on to the structure of living things, how changing environments create consequences for living things and perspectives on those changes in our next unit "Sharing the Planet".

Reading intervention/enrichment for our scholars began on September 21. It is important that all our scholars are supported and advanced as necessary to be proficient readers. Please continue to encourage the scholars to read for 30 minutes EVERY night.

By now, you should have received your child's progress report! It was sent home September 16th. It is hard to believe the first grading period ends on October 9th. Any questions or concerns please feel free to reach out to your child's teacher.
