WHAT ARE CONNECTIONS?

- STUDENTS TYPICALLY ROTATE THROUGH DIFFERENT CONNECTIONS COURSES EACH QUARTER THROUGHOUT MIDDLE SCHOOL
 - GIVE STUDENTS EXPOSURE TO A VARIETY OF EXPERIENCES
 - FACILITATE IDENTIFICATION OF INTERESTS
 - PREPARE STUDENTS TO SELECT SUBJECTS IN HIGH SCHOOL
 - PROVIDE ADDITIONAL SUPPORT OR ENRICHMENT
- MOST CONNECTIONS ARE RANDOMLY GENERATED
- STUDENTS TYPICALLY TAKE P.E. EACH QUARTER AS ONE CONNECTIONS COURSE
- STUDENTS TYPICALLY ROTATE THROUGH OTHER CONNECTIONS COURSES

MIDDLE SCHOOL SCHEDULING CHANGES

- MOVE TO A 6 PERIOD UNBALANCED HYBRID SCHEDULE
- 4 CORE ACADEMIC COURSES TIME FLEXES FROM APPROXIMATELY 52
 MINUTES TO 65 MINUTES PER COURSE (MINUS TRANSITION TIME)
- 2 CONNECTIONS TIME REMAINS THE SAME AT APPROXIMATELY 50
 MINUTES PER COURSE
- STUDENTS MEET WITH ALL CORE ACADEMIC CLASSES ON MONDAY, TUESDAY AND FRIDAY
- STUDENTS MEET IN AN EXTENDED INSTRUCTIONAL TIME FOR CORE CLASSES ON WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY (A DAY AND B DAY)
- DAILY EXTENDED LEARNING TIME (ELT) APPROXIMATELY 30 MINUTES PER DAY AND ENCOMPASSES VARYING ACTIVITIES SUCH AS SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING AND CAREER EXPLORATION

DRESS CODE

- DRESS CODE IS DESCRIBED IN THE STUDENT HANDBOOK. PLEASE READ THOROUGHLY TO INSURE THAT YOUR CHILDREN'S SCHOOL CLOTHES ARE SCHOOL APPROPRIATE.
- SOME HIGHLIGHTS:
 - NO HOLES IN PANTS (JEANS) ABOVE THE KNEE
 - SHIRTS MUST BE AT LEAST 3" AT THE SHOULDERS (NO SPAGHETTI STRAPS OR LARGE ARM HOLES)
 - LEGGINGS ARE ALLOWED WITH LONG SHIRTS ONLY. SHIRT LENGTH IS TO FINGER TIPS AND MUST COVER BOTH FRONT AND BACK
 - HATS AND HOODS ARE NOT ALLOWED UNLESS IT IS A CHARITABLE "HAT DAY"

MOBILE PHONES AND DEVICES

- YOUR STUDENT WILL BE ASSIGNED A LAPTOP TO USE DURING THE SCHOOL DAY, SO PERSONAL DEVICES ARE RARELY USED IN THE CLASSROOM.
 STUDENTS MAY HAVE A DEVICE AT SCHOOL BUT IT SHOULD BE TURNED OFF AND STORED IN A LOCKER DURING SCHOOL HOURS.
- IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT PARENTS MONITOR ALL DEVICES IN THE EVENINGS TO ENSURE THAT CHILDREN GET ENOUGH SLEEP.

ATTENDANCE

- RESEARCH SHOWS THAT STUDENTS WHO ARE AT SCHOOL EVERY DAY PERFORM BETTER!
- IF YOUR CHILD IS SICK, PLEASE PROVIDE A DOCTOR'S NOTE SO THAT WE CAN EXCUSE THE ABSENCE
 - SOMETIMES A DOCTOR VISIT IS NOT NECESSARY. WE CAN ACCEPT A PARENT NOTE FOR THE FIRST 7 ABSENCES. AFTER THAT, A DOCTOR'S NOTE IS REQUIRED.
 - IF A STUDENT IS ABSENT FOR 3 CONSECUTIVE DAYS, A DOCTOR'S NOTE IS NEEDED
- SCHEDULE VACATIONS DURING SCHOOL BREAKS. CHEROKEE COUNTY SCHOOLS PUBLISHES THE SCHOOL YEAR CALENDAR SEVERAL YEARS IN ADVANCE. YOU MAY ACCESS CALENDARS HERE:

PE UNIFORMS AND CLUBS

- STUDENTS WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO PURCHASE P.E. UNIFORMS AND P.E. LOCKERS DURING THE WALK THROUGH IN JULY.
- P.E. UNIFORMS ARE NOT REQUIRED. STUDENTS MAY WEAR SOLID SHORTS AND TEES IN SCHOOL COLORS
- THERE ARE MANY CLUBS AT E.T. BOOTH! STUDENTS WHO GET INVOLVED IN A CLUB OR ACTIVITY TEND TO ENJOY SCHOOL MORE AND THE TRANSITION TO A NEW SCHOOL IS ACCOMPLISHED MORE EASILY.

LOCKERS AND BOOK BAGS

- LOCKERS ARE ASSIGNED THROUGH HOMEROOM
- SOME 6TH GRADERS WILL HAVE TO SHARE LOCKERS.
- LOCKER SHELVES ARE USEFUL, AS ARE THE MAGNETIC CONTAINERS FOR PENS/PENCILS.
- LARGE BOOK BAGS MAY NOT FIT IN LOCKERS.
- STUDENTS ARE DISMISSED FROM BUS DUTY TO GO TO LOCKERS AND BATHROOMS BEFORE 1ST PERIOD. THEY WILL HAVE SCHEDULED LOCKER BREAKS THROUGHOUT THE DAY.
- STUDENTS MAY USE STRING BAGS TO HELP CARRY THEIR BELONGINGS BETWEEN CLASSES. THEY MAY NOT CARRY A BOOK BAG.
- ROLLING BACKPACKS ARE NOT ALLOWED



TRANSITION TO MIDDLE SCHOOL

The transition to middle school may be one of the toughest transitions during childhood, for both parents and kids.



PROCEDURAL CONCERNS

- GETTING LOST OR FINDING CLASSES
- FINDING AND OPENING THE LOCKER
- FINDING THE BATHROOM
- NOT KNOWING THE SCHOOL RULES
- CARRYING AROUND ALL THOSE BOOKS
- GOING FROM CLASS TO CLASS WITHOUT BEING LATE
- BRINGING THE RIGHT MATERIALS TO THE RIGHT CLASS AT THE RIGHT TIME
- TRAVELING LONGER DISTANCES TO SCHOOL
- EATING IN A LARGER CAFETERIA

PROCEDURAL CONCERNS: WHAT PARENTS CAN DO

- BUY A COMBINATION LOCK BEFORE SCHOOL AND HAVE YOUR CHILD SPEND TIME TRYING TO OPEN THE LOCK.
- GO TO THE WALK THROUGH BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS WITH A COPY OF YOUR CHILD'S SCHEDULE. TAKE A FEW MINUTES TO WALK FROM ROOM TO ROOM WITH YOUR CHILD.
- DON'T BUY BACKPACKS THAT CAN STORE 50 LBS. OF MATERIALS. THEY WON'T FIT IN THE LOCKER, AND SMALLER BACKPACKS ALLOW FOR BETTER ORGANIZATION.

- GETTING GOOD GRADES
- COMPETITION FOR GRADES
- HAVING MORE THAN ONE TEACHER
- MORE HOMEWORK
- MORE LONG-TERM PROJECTS
- WORK THAT IS MORE CHALLENGING AND REQUIRES MORE EFFORT
- EXPECTATIONS OF TEACHERS IN DIFFERENT SUBJECT AREAS
- BASIC TASKS SUCH AS STUDYING, TAKING NOTES, AND TAKING TESTS

ACADEMIC CONCERNS: WHAT PARENTS CAN DO

- BE THE EXAMPLE ... SHOW THE IMPORTANCE OF EDUCATION
- ASK YOUR CHILD ABOUT THEIR DAY (USE SPECIFIC, OPEN ENDED QUESTIONS)
- SET ASIDE A QUIET SPACE AND TIME FOR YOUR CHILD TO STUDY/COMPLETE HOMEWORK
- BALANCE SCHOOL WORK AND PLAY TIME
- ENCOURAGE READING
- ASSIST YOUR CHILD WITH THEIR HOMEWORK AND/OR CHECK THEIR HOMEWORK DAILY
- SET HIGH BUT REACHABLE EXPECTATIONS FOR YOUR CHILD
- ENCOURAGEMENT!

SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL CONCERNS

- BULLIES AND/OR BEING TEASED
- MAKING NEW FRIENDS/FINDING AND CONNECTING WITH A PEER GROUP
- FEELING STUPID COMPARED TO OTHER KIDS
- SUCCESS IN SPORTS
- POPULARITY
- BEING EMBARRASSED BY PARENTS IN FRONT OF OTHER KIDS
- PUBERTY (PIMPLES, BODY CHANGES)
- CHANGING BEFORE AND AFTER P.E. IN FRONT OF OTHER KIDS
- HAVING GIRLFRIENDS AND BOYFRIENDS
- HAVING SOMEONE TO SIT WITH AT LUNCH
- PRESSURE TO BREAK THE RULES Jackson, McKinnon, and Wilson (2006)

SOCIAL/EMOTIONAL CONCERNS: WHAT PARENTS CAN DO

- INCREASE YOUR KNOWLEDGE OF ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT
- BE UPBEAT ABOUT WHAT LIES AHEAD
- RECOGNIZE THEIR FEARS
- OFFER SUPPORT
- HOLD YOUR CHILD ACCOUNTABLE
- GIVE YOUR CHILD THE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE DECISIONS ON HIS/HER OWN
- PICK YOUR BATTLES
- GIVE THEM TOOLS THEY NEED TO SUCCEED
- ALLOW THEM THE FREEDOM TO MAKE MISTAKES

WHAT PARENTS CAN DO AT SCHOOL

- MAINTAIN A GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR CHILD' S TEACHERS
- VISIT THE SCHOOL: OPEN HOUSE, CURRICULUM NIGHT
- KNOW AND UNDERSTAND SCHOOL RULES
- ATTEND MEETINGS (PTSA, CONFERENCES, ETC.) AND CHILD' S ACTIVITIES
- MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD ATTENDS SCHOOL DAILY
- VOLUNTEER IN ANY WAY YOU CAN *PTSA, MEDIA CENTER, FRONT OFFICE, FIELD TRIPS*
- MAKE A CONTRACT WITH YOUR CHILD AND/OR TEACHER
- IF YOU HAVE RAISED ADOLESCENTS, BE WILLING TO SHARE ADVICE AND INFORMATION WITH OTHER PARENTS



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
