April 6-9 Highland-Craigmont FFA Participated in their State Convention. We had 19 FFA members travel down to the Hells Canyon Grand Hotel in Lewiston to celebrate the 90th State Convention.

We had four members participate in the State Farm Business Management Career Development Event. The four members were Lane Wassmuth, Taiylor Crea, Payton Crow and Keira White, and a great job to them!

Our reporter Keira White, submitted a handmade scrapbook in Division 2; it is filled with pictures/articles with every event that the FFA chapter went to. Thank You to the Lewis County Herald for publishing all of our articles for the past year, which gave us many points towards the competition. The scrapbook was graded two days after, and it got 1st place at State. This is the first time our chapter has earned this honor.

Olivia Antone received a bronze ranking in the Sheep Production segment in the State Proficiency Award. We are proud of her for applying for her first State FFA award! Kobe Droegmiller received a silver ranking in Turf Grass management in the State Proficiency Award.
