The top members from our team and the soils class then packed their bags and traveled to Burley, Idaho on October 13th for the State FFA Land and Homesite Evaluation Event. The members who attended were Kalei Smith, Jace Roeller, Olivia Antone, Chani Brammer, Marcus Langner, Trevor Knowlton, Sydney Shumaker, and Aiden Miller.

The team did great, especially for their first time at state for all our members and first-year judging soils for nearly all of our members, and they finsished in 9th place. Notable individuals included Kalei and Jace, who tied for 17th, and Olivia in 35th.

The FFA Chapter also hosted Creed and Degree Night on October 19th, with results to be included in a future article, and an American Red Cross Blood Drive on the 20th.

The chapter also has 3 members attending the National FFA Convention during the last week of October in Indianapolis, Indiana.

The chapter is hosting our annual Butterbraids Fundraiser with orders due on November 2nd with a delivery date still to be determined, but we are hoping to get them before Thanksgiving.

Our chapter would like to thank all of our supporters, those who help judge events, provide resources for us to study, and those who support our fundraisers.

In Mrs. Davis' Science classes - Biology - starting genetics, Earth Science - studying geology, Forensic Science - starting facial reconstruction from skulls, Physical Science - working on compounds and mixtures, Anatomy and Physiology - working on bones of the skull, and Environmental Science - study of the effects of La Palma, Canary Islands, volcanic eruption on air quality in the local and regional area.

Ms. Anderson and the 3rd grade learned why leaves change color. It turns out that the colors are hiding under the chlorophyll that makes the leaves green. When the sun isn't shining as long, the chlorophyll breaks down, revealing the carotene (yellow and oranges) and anthocyanin (reds and purples) that were hiding under the chlorophyll.

From Mr. Berry - in 5th grade, we're learning about Columbus Day and its significance to our nation's history.

And, in Mrs. Randall's 2nd grade – students have read 114 library books this year!

Our school year is off to a great start – and the best is yet to come!
