

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s) of AP students,

If you have received this email, then your student is currently enrolled in one or more AP courses. AP Testing is quickly approaching! This email is to be used as a resource to help answer any preliminary questions you may have.

### **EXAM SCHEDULE/TESTING DAY INFORMATION**

- IN PERSON (PAPER/PENCIL) AP Testing will occur between May 2 – May 20
  - [CLICK HERE>>](#) to see the specific course dates. Please note that these dates and times are set by **College Board** and must be followed.
  - Morning sessions start at 8:00am and afternoon sessions start at 12:00pm. The only exception to this is the Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism exam that starts at 2pm.
  - Please note...due to the specific dates and times set by College Board, **AP exams TAKE PRIORITY OVER ANY/ALL OTHER EXAMS**. This includes FSA, EOC, and final exams.
  - If a student is participating in an AP course through Bartram Trail High School, **TESTING FEES WERE COVERED BY THE SCHOOL!** Students NOT enrolled in BTHS courses (home education students) had to pay these fees.
  - If a student **does not show up for an exam that was ordered for them**, they will be charged the \$140 fee per exam they miss.

### **HOW DO AP TESTS WORK?**

- Most AP tests are two to three hours long and consist of two sections:
  - **SECTION 1:** Multiple Choice
  - **SECTION 2:** Long Response (Essay)
- AP Scores will be made available to students the first full week of July via the student's College Board account. Students will receive a score between 1 and 5.
