

# BTHS ON CAMPUS DUAL ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

## LIMITED SEATS AVAILABLE FOR THESE COURSES

IMPORTANT DATES - These deadlines and dates are different for off campus Dual Enrollment courses and Academy Dual Enrollment courses

- **Wednesday, February 17 (Tentative):** On-line Application opens for on BTHS CAMPUS DE for the 2021-2022 School Year for 11th grade. A follow up email will be sent once the link opens.
- **Wednesday, February 24:** Students should have on-line application completed and accurate 'signature page' turned in (without counselors signature) for on BTHS campus DE for 11th grade. **(NO EXCEPTIONS)**
- **Wednesday, February 24:** Students should have a complete set of qualifying placement test scores\*\* turned in for on BTHS campus DE for 11th grade. **(NO EXCEPTIONS)**  
\*\*Student can mix and match their best scores from ACT, SAT, or PERT. Test scores must be less than two years old.

\*\*\*\*Please be advised that BTHS **will not** be offering testing on campus for qualifying scores this year. BTHS can no longer offer the PERT exam on campus. Students will need to make arrangements to test at the college, contact SJR Testing at 386-312-4228. If you do not meet the qualifying scores by February 24, you will not be permitted to enroll in the course on our campus. You will, however, still have the opportunity to enroll in off campus dual enrollment courses permitted you meet the academic requirements.

\*\*\*\*Deadline to submit scores is Wednesday, February 24 for **on campus** dual enrollment. Please submit all paperwork to Mrs. Richardson at the guidance desk in the main building office areas.

\*\*\*\*If you do not meet the score requirement to qualify for the dual enrollment course(s) you will be placed in an honors or standard level English course.

### Course options:

- 1st Semester: ENC1101: Composition 1\*
- Requirements:
  - Must be a **JUNIOR** during the 2021-2022 school year
  - Unweighted GPA of a 3.0 or higher
  - Qualifying Test Scores from one of the following or a combination of:
    - SAT = Reading 24, Writing & Language 25
    - ACT = Reading 19, English 17
    - CPT = Reading 83, Sentence Skills 83
    - PERT = 106 Reading, 103 Writing
  - Attendance: students must have 4 or less **unexcused** absences for the 2020-2021 school year.
- 2nd Semester: ENC1102: Composition 2\*
- Requirements: Completion of ENC1101 with a grade of "C" or better
- 1st Semester: AMH2010: United States History to 1877
  - Must be a **JUNIOR** during the 2021-2022 school year
  - Unweighted GPA of a 3.0 or higher
  - Qualifying Test Scores from one of the following or a combination of:
    - SAT = Reading 24, Writing & Language 25

- ACT = Reading 19, English 17
- CPT = Reading 83, Sentence Skills 83
- PERT = 106 Reading, 103 Writing
- Attendance: students must have 4 or less **unexcused** absences for the 2020-2021 school year.
- 2nd Semester: AMH2020: United States History from 1877
  - Requirements: Completion of AMH2010 with a grade of “C” or better

### Additional information

- Students will be required to take and pass AMH2010 and AMH2020 with a “C” or better to fulfill the American History graduation requirement.
- Students will receive 1.0 high school credit in English through completion of ENC 1101 and 1.0 high school credit through the completion of ENC1102 (**earning 2.0 English credits for the school year**).
- Students will, more than likely, receive their 4<sup>th</sup> high school English credit (completing their high school English requirements for graduation)

We would recommend one or more of the following options for their senior year:

- Take an additional English course:
  - AP English Literature on the Bartram Trail High School campus
  - ENC 2210 Technical and Professional Report Writing
  - AML 2010 (American Literature 1), AML 2020 (American Literature 2), or LIT 2000 (Introduction to Literature) on the St Johns River State College campus
  - Take another Dual Enrollment course option that fits your student’s projected collegiate field of study instead of an additional English course.

### **Step by step process for BTHS CAMPUS dual enrollment:**

- Step 1 – Read Principles of Participation agreement
- Step 2 – If student has not already earned qualifying placement scores from either the ACT, SAT, or PERT in both Reading and Writing/Language or English, student should contact SJRSC testing office at 386-312-4228 to schedule a PERT test.
- Step 3 – When St Johns River State College opens the fall 2021 dual enrollment application (tentative date, February 17), completely fill out the online application. A follow up email with the application link will be sent when the application opens.
- Step 4 – After filing out the Fall 2021 Dual Enrollment application, turn in completed and accurate ‘signature page’ (without counselors signature) to Mrs. Richards\* in the main guidance office by 3 pm on Wednesday, 2/24/21. - Step 5 – Turn in a complete set of qualifying placement test scores\*\* from either the ACT, SAT, or PERT to Mrs. Richards\* in the main guidance office by 3 pm on Wednesday, 2/24/21.
  - \*Distance Learners can email both the signature page and test scores to Mrs. Richards at [Kathleen.Richards@stjohns.k12.fl.us](mailto:Kathleen.Richards@stjohns.k12.fl.us)
  - \*\*Student can mix and match their best scores from ACT, SAT, or PERT. Test scores must be less than two years old.
- Step 6 – Fill out THIS FORM by 3 pm on Wednesday, 2/24/21 with what dual enrollment class(es) you want on your schedule next year: ENC & AMH, ENC only, or AMH only
