Equitable Services

A geographic district who receives Title IV funding must provide services to: 1) eligible private school students, 2) their teachers, and (3) other educational personnel consistent with the number of eligible students enrolled in private elementary and secondary schools in the geographic area served by the LEA. These services and other benefits must be equitable in comparison to those provided to: 1) public school students, 2) their teachers, and 3) other educational personnel participating in the program.

To ensure equitable participation, a district:

- Engage in timely and meaningful consultation with private school officials;
- Assess, address, and evaluate the needs of private school ELs, their teachers, and other educational personnel;
- Spend an amount of funds on a per-pupil basis equal to those funds expended for participating public school students.
- **Note:** The district retains control of the Title IV funding. There is no allocation or transfer of Title IV funds required from the LEA to the private school—only the provision of services.
