Habit 5: Seek first to understand, then to be understood. What can I do at home?

<u>Watch Your Tone!</u> We add meaning to the words we use by the way we say them—our tone of voice. Write the following phrases on pieces of paper: • What are you thinking? • I'm really excited for you! • Okay, I will help.

Invite family members to choose one of the phrases and use several different tones of voice with the same phrase. Does the meaning change? How?

<u>Mood Charades</u> - Write several different emotions (anger, sadness, happiness, disappointment, etc.) on small pieces of paper and put them in a box. Have each family member draw one of the papers out of the box. Invite each family member to act out the mood on the paper they drew while the others try to guess the emotion. Point out that you can learn a lot about what others are trying to say by using your eyes to watch their faces and body movements.



Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood.

I listen to other people's ideas and feelings. I try to see things from their viewpoints. I listen to others without interrupting. I am confident in voicing my ideas. I look people in the eyes when talking.

Note from Nurse Reynolds Asthma Flare-ups

Signs of an asthma

flare-up may include:

- *wheezing
- *coughing
- *chest tightness
- *shortness of breath

Signs of a severe asthma

flare-up may include:

- *trouble breathing when sitting still
- *difficulty speaking without pausing
- *feeling tired or drowsy
- *blueness around lips
- *areas below the child's ribs, between ribs, and in the neck sink in with each attempt to inhale.

If the child shows signs of a severe flare-up, call 911.
