



ARC is helping kids love to read!







The Georgia Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills 2.0 (GKIDS 2.0) is a yearlong, progression-based formative assessment. GKIDS 2.0 is aligned to the Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) for kindergarten and is organized around big ideas and learning progressions.

Using the learning progressions from GKIDS 2.0 for the report card allows teachers and parents to have a common understanding of expectations of knowledge and skills a student needs to be prepared for first grade.

Students will be graded in Language Arts and Math using the grades: <u>Not</u> Yet Demonstrated, Beginning, Emerging, Developing, Demonstrating and Exceeding.



Throughout the school year, your child's performance may range from Not Yet Demonstrating to Exceeding.

BYOT (Optional) Things to Know

We teach responsible use of BYOT and provide tasks related to academic topics, as well as utilize devices for skills practice

Filtered internet in school

Controlled usage and established classroom rules

Locked in the classroom when out of the room

Used during computer centers; educational apps for reading and math

It's okay if you don't have a device to send or want your child bringing one. We have many one here for each student to use!



Lunch? Let's eat!



- Families can pay by check, cash, or online. If you send lunch money in the daily folder, label with child's name, purpose for money, and amount sent.
- Teachers do not keep track of account balances. The cafeteria manager, Deb Mason, can answer account questions.
- Once restrictions for visitors are lifted, parents are welcome to join us any day and are invited to eat on the stage. Please meet us in the cafeteria rather than the classroom. Also say good-bye in the lunchroom, so that we can get to our next planned activity quickly.
- Ice cream cannot be charged. If there isn't enough money in the account, your child will not receive ice cream. Most classes have one day each week for an ice cream treat.










Meet Nurse Janet







- Notify both the nurse and your child's teacher of allergies and medical needs.
- All medication left at school must have a form signed by you. Nurse Janet handles all medication. Teachers do not administer meds.
- Please do not send cough drops or medicine with your child.
- We will send your child to the clinic if he or she gets sick at school.
 Children must be fever free without the aid of medication for 24 hours before returning to school.
- Your child might get sick more in kindergarten than other years, so it is important to be here and on time every day possible.

Kindergarten has changed!



- Kindergarten is very academic.
- We follow the state standards and Forsyth County guidelines for our instruction. These have increased rigor.
- Curriculum is taught in small, differentiated groups during the majority of our day.
- Instruction is assessment driven.
- Kindergarteners are amazing and can learn so much! Practicing learned skills is very important.

Transportation

Absences


How to help your child next year...
