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Hello Highland Families!!

I can't believe we are already a full quarter into the school year! Time is flying by but I am enjoying every minute I have with our students! It is fun to see them in the classroom engaged in learning and enriching activities. On the sports front, we are wrapping up our fall season. Other activities include FFA qualifying for State Soils, and BPA ramping up for a great year. I also want to acknowledge and congratulate our 4H and FFA members on another successful year at the Nez Perce and Lewis County Fairs! I am always impressed with how involved our student body is in extra activities. Their involvement helps create well rounded individuals!

I want to remind all families that attendance really does matter! Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school year, or about 14 days in our district, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's less than two days a month! We understand not all absences can be avoided, and we do not encourage students to come if they are too ill. I also want to make clear that even excused absences count toward your child's attendance record and you may receive a letter if your student misses more than 5 days of school in one semester. The letter is intended to make you aware of your student's standing. After 7 absences in one semester your student will be referred to the attendance committee. The attendance committee's job is to look over absence reports and if deemed necessary, refer to the superintendent, who then may refer to the school board. Notifying the school, sending doctor's notes and pre-arranging absences are all encouraged.

Another thing to remember is that parent teacher conferences are here! Elementary conferences have been scheduled for November 1-3 and Junior High and High School Conferences will be held in the gym November 1st and 2nd from 4-7 pm. We hope to see everyone there!

Sweet or savory food?

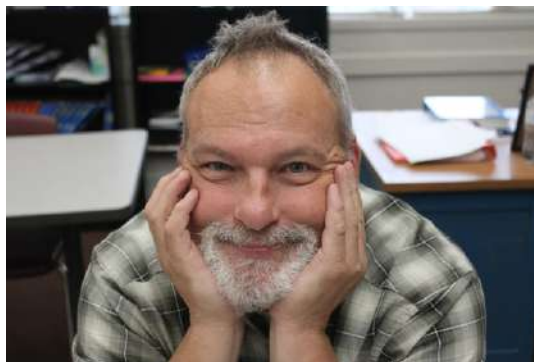
"Honestly, I would say sweet."

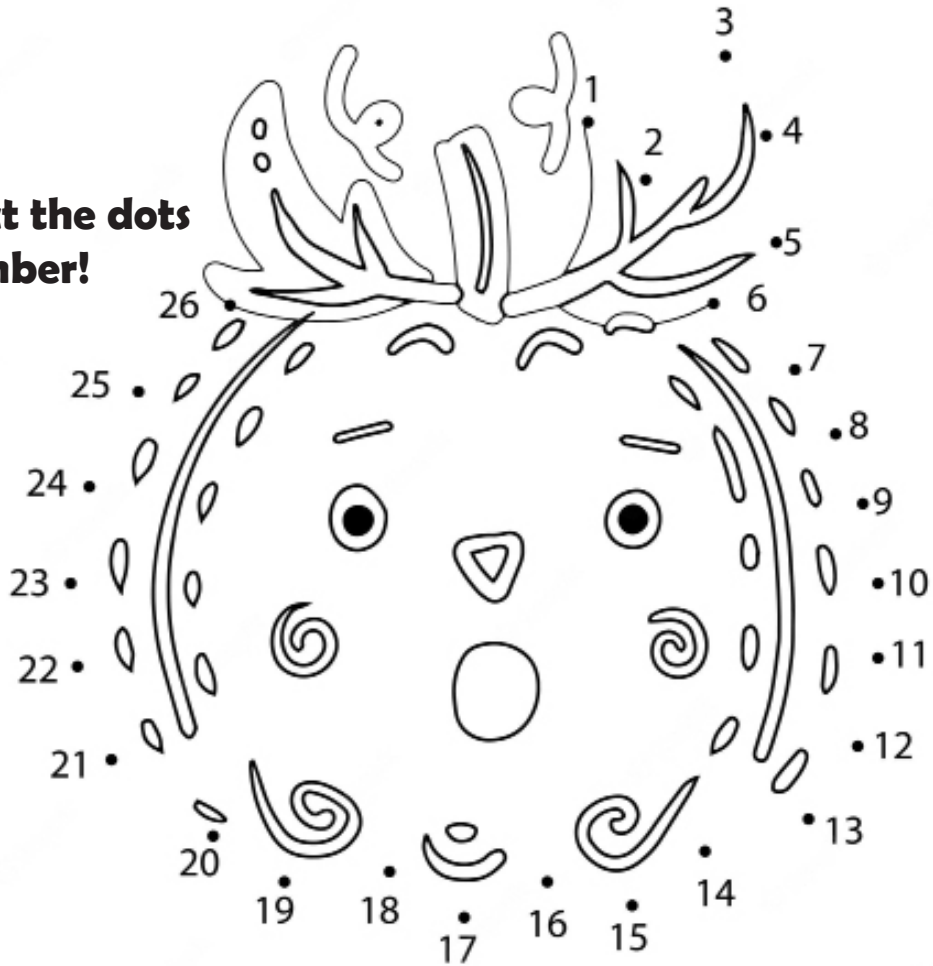
Clay Buchanan is our Senior High School Student of The Month!

His favorite food is a bacon cheese burger and his favorite sport is football.

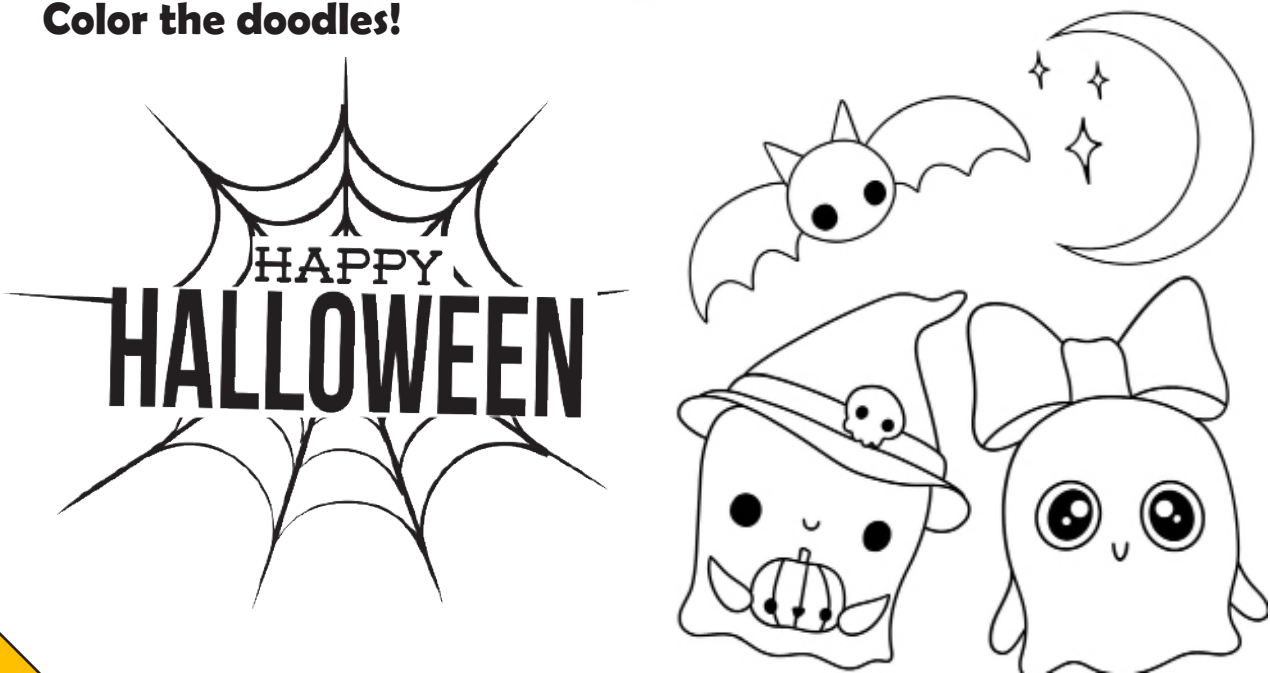
