- 3. A faculty selection committee appointed by the Principal, consisting of five (5) faculty members, will review the applications and recommendations for final selections.
- 4. Membership decisions will be communicated via letter directly to students. Those accepted for membership will receive details regarding an Induction Ceremony second semester.

Deadline for application: 2:30 p.m. on January 13, 2023.

GPA <u>does not</u> guarantee acceptance into the National Junior Honor Society program. You must print the Report Card from HAC the Front Office will <u>not</u> print report cards for you.

- <u>Four</u> teacher recommendation forms: It is <u>your</u> responsibility to put your name on the forms. You can only use **one** recommendation from a previous year's teacher.
