PRINCIPAL ARAKAKI'S MESSAGE




Kindergarten GE process starts on February 1, 2023. They must register their child at their child's home school first, fill out the GE form and turn in to their child's home school or get the principal to sign the GE form and finally turn in to Pauoa starting on Feb. 1 for new incoming Kindergarteners who will turn 5 by August 1, 2023.

For our outgoing 5th graders, you will need to fill out a new GE form for middle school and have me sign the GE before submitting to the middle school of your choice. If you have any questions regarding GE's, feel free to let me know.

GE Information

Geographic Exception SY 2023-2024. If you know a family who is interested in enrolling at Pauoa Elementary but resides outside our school boundary or if you are interested in enrolling your child to a school outside his/her home school boundary, the GE Application form must be completed and submitted to the home school (for new students) or current school for

students who are already enrolled and plan to change to another DOE school. (e.g. for middle school).

If you are currently on a GE at Pauoa you do NOT need to re-apply each year.

(The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.) GE applications for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year shall be submitted between January 3 and March 1 2023 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year.

- Don't forget to include with your GE application: SASE (Self Addressed Stamped Envelope)
- Proof of residency document (e.g. Utility bill)




