

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Bonneville Joint School District No. 93 Board of Trustees shall award a regular high school diploma to every student enrolled in the District who meets the requirements of graduation established by the District and the State Board of Education. The official transcript will indicate the specific courses taken and level of achievement.

Guidelines

Graduation Requirements

1. High school graduation requirements shall be established which, as a minimum, satisfy those established by the State Board of Education (IDAPA 08.02.03.105).
 - a. Generally, any change in graduation requirements promulgated by the Board will become effective for the next class to enter ninth grade.
 - b. Exceptions to this general rule may be made where it is determined by the Board that the proposed change in graduation requirements will not have a negative effect on students already in grades nine through twelve (9-12).
 - c. The Board shall consider and vote on whether to approve graduation requirements as recommended by the Superintendent/designee.
2. All students graduating from any Bonneville Joint School District No. 93 High School must be proficient in the state civics and government content standards either through the completion of the civics test or an alternate path and it shall be noted on the student's high school transcript.
3. To graduate from any Bonneville Joint School District No. 93 High School, a student must be currently enrolled in that high school and reported to the State Department as enrolled at that school.
4. A student who possesses a disabling condition shall satisfy those competency requirements which are incorporated into the Individualized Education Program (IEP). Satisfactory completion of the objectives incorporated into the IEP shall serve as the basis for determining completion of a course pursuant to the standards set forth in the Idaho Special Education Manual.

Participation in Graduation Ceremonies

1. Student attendance and participation in graduation ceremonies is not a requirement.
2. Participation in graduation ceremonies is a privilege extended to students.

3. A student may be denied participation in graduation ceremonies if state and local requirements for graduation have not been completed prior to the date of the ceremony.
4. In such instances, the diploma will be awarded after the official ceremony has been held.

DEFINITION:

Enrolled: A student is considered enrolled if he/she attends at least four (4) classes at that school during the week. Attending a Released Time class is not allowed as one of the four (4) required classes.
