Special thanks to Coach Roddy Sueoka, UH Vulcan baseball coach for helping to gather the different athletes to help our students experience the joy of playing sports.


Our students learned and experienced more about baseball, softball, soccer, basketball, and volleyball!



Nurse's Corner: Decision-Making

As a parent have you ever wondered,

"How can I help my child/teen make appropriate decisions?"

Are there steps to teach them?

Where do I start?
When should I start?

Children have the ability to make decisions at a very young age. We can help them with their decision making skills as they grow. Here's a few tips to help your child make decisions:

1. Provide time to discuss decision making with your children.

Find time to talk with your child(ren) regarding making a choice.

2. Involve your children in everyday decisions.

Include your children in your own decisions and ask them for suggestions. Then go over the pros and cons of each suggestion. Review why it's a pro vs a con, due to the outcome/consequences of the suggestion.

3. Give them a chance to practice these skills.

This allows them to make decisions, by providing scenarios.

4. Ask them questions to promote decisions.

If you were in the same situation, would you make the same decision or make a different decision? And why would you agree or change that decision?

5. Review consequences of decisions.

Regardless of the outcome. It's important to review the consequences, provide appropriate feedback, praise, and/or suggestions.


