In Delaware you must hold <u>both</u> a <u>License</u> and at least one <u>Certificate</u>. The License authorizes you to work in a District/Charter and the Certificate identifies the area you are authorized to practice.

APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION are accepted online only through our Delaware Educator Data System (DEEDS) https://deeds.doe.k12.de.us.

GENERAL LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited four-year institution
- Completion of student teaching as part of a Teacher Prep Program
- Passing score on Praxis Core Academic Skills Test or approved alternative
- Passing score on a Content Knowledge Exam (Praxis II, ACTFL)

Alternative Routes (no student teaching):

- DE employment and enrollment in a DE-approved Alternate Route Program OR
- DE employment and one year in lieu of student teaching in a <u>non-core</u> <u>content area</u>

TESTING REQUIREMENTS:

• General Knowledge Exam:

Core Academic Skills for Educators Reading, Writing and Mathematics (or approved alternative) are required for licensure. National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) educators and out-of-state educators with reciprocal credentials are exempt.

• Content Knowledge Exam:

Applicants must pass an examination of content knowledge, such as Praxis II or ACTFL when applicable and available. NBPTS educators and out-of-state educators with reciprocal credentials are exempt.

DELAWARE OFFERS 3 LICENSES:

Initial License - Issued to an educator who has less than three years of experience. An Initial Inactive License will be issued if the educator is not employed with a Delaware District/Charter School. The Inactive Initial license is a full and valid License. Upon employment the Initial License is activated and valid for three years. Mentoring and satisfactory evaluations are required.

Continuing License -This is a five-year renewable license and may be obtained through one of the following options:

- Graduate from an Initial License OR
- Hold reciprocal credentials from another state, have three years of full-time credentialed teaching experience in that state, and two satisfactory summative evaluations equivalent to Delaware's evaluations.

Ninety clock hours are required to renew a Continuing License every five years.

Advanced License - This ten-year license may only be obtained by holding current National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification. Educators are not required to obtain an Advanced License.

DELAWARE OFFERS 2 CERTIFICATES:

Standard Certificate – All requirements are met.

Emergency Certificate – Requirements outstanding.

- Educator must be employed by a Delaware public school.
- Emergency must be requested by the employer.
- Emergency is valid for one year.
