Students and teachers have been working all year toward student mastery in many courses. One way that mastery is measured will be standardized testing in certain classes. We'll be administering several standardized tests over these last weeks. Here are the upcoming testing windows:

- April 11 May 20: Post Assessment SLOs
 - o Required assessment for all classes that <u>will not</u> take a Milestones End-of-Course test.
- April 18 April 29, 2016: CTAE End-of-Pathway Assessments
 - Taken by students completing their CTAE pathway.
 - A measurement used to ascertain the level of technical skill attained in the applicable pathway.
- May 2 -13: Advanced Placement (AP) Exams
 - o Taken by students who have been enrolled in AP classes for the school year.
- May 4 20: Georgia Milestones End-of-Course tests
 - o Taken by students in: 9th Grade English; 11th Grade English; Coordinate Algebra; Analytic Geometry; Biology; Physical Science; US History and Economics.
 - These exams count 20% of a student's final grade.
