Powerschool:



<u>Powerschool</u> is a wonderful way to see how your student is performing on the fourth-grade standards. The office can assist you in setting up an account.

Your student's teacher tries very hard to enter grades as soon as possible. Please allow <u>at least</u> 24 hours to process.

COMMUNICATION:



Blue Folders: Most classes send the blue folder home daily, so students must have them at school everyday. This is a great way of communicating between you and your student's teacher whether it be a note, excuse, money, etc.

Class DOJO: If you haven't already, please sign up. This is our main form of communication especially when it comes to letting you know up to date information about what is going on in the school, classroom, or with your student. Texts can be sent back and forth between the parent and teacher. Just be mindful that while we are working with students during the school day, we may not

see them until after school. So, if it has to do with how a child is getting home, you need to get in touch with the office.

Blue folders (aka Wednesday folder)-

Students must have their blue folder at school daily. This is used to store their nightly homework.

Graded and important papers go home each Wednesday in the blue folders.

Debit cards – These are stored in the blue folders so that parents have a daily way to check on their student's behavior. (More on Patriot bucks to follow)

Breakfast -

- -Leave gum, candy, toys, and other unacceptable items at home.


Debit CARDS:

MULTIPLICATION

Students coming to 4th grade should have <u>mastered</u> their multiplication facts.

Mastery of multiplication facts will make it easier to learn and master the new concepts of multiplying larger numbers, fractions, etc. Let's look at how your student will learn to multiply: 1 digit by 2 digits 1 digit by 3 digits 1 digit by 4 digits and 2 digits by 2 digits

DIVISION
