Chiefess Kapi'olani Elementary School students in the 4th grade visited and learned about the history of some of our local landmarks, including Lili'uokalani Gardens and Moku'ola (commonly known as Coconut Island).

The students learned the history of Lili`uokalani Park, the Queen's Garden, and how it came about.

As our students walked throughout the park, they were able to see the various Japanese influences and learned about the connection with Japan and Queen Lili'uokalani. Some Japanese inspired park features are the Eastern Gate, which symbolizes that all are welcome. Another prominent Japanese park feature includes the lion statues that greet and protect those who enter the park. As a gift, the students presented a lei to each of the lion statues.

The 4th grade students continued to learn about the surrounding area, Moku'ola. The island commonly known as Coconut Island, which was considered a place of healing. In the past, people would visit Moku'ola to get well, just as we visit the hospital today to heal.

Thank you to Kupuna Loke and Kumu Awai for sharing your insight with our students about these local landmarks. By visiting these locations our students got to experience the Japanese garden and gained a better understanding of the history behind Moku`ola.



We hope you all had a wonderful school year. As the school year ends you're probably planning your summer outings. Here's some summer safety tips and reminders.

1. Apply sunscreen anytime you're outdoors.

The American Academy of Dermatology recommend:

- Use broad spectrum protection, protecting against both UVA and UVB rays
- Resistant to water and sweat
- SPF 30 or higher.

2. First Aid kit.

Pack a simple first aid kit to help with injuries that may occur while outdoors. I would suggest it include:

- Band-Aids of all sizes
- Gauze and tape
- Antibiotic ointment
- Hydrocortisone cream

3. Consume water. It's extremely important to stay hydrated while you're outside over the summer. Don't wait till you're thirsty to drink, by then you're already low on fluids. Drink often, consume at least 8-11 cups per day.

4. Know the signs of heat exhaustion. Heat exhaustion or stroke occurs when the body can't properly cool itself. This is extremely dangerous because it can lead to damage to the brain and other vital organs. Signs can include one or more of the following:

* Dizziness *Muscle cramping *Weakness *Fatique *Confusion *Heart palpitations. *Nausea If you notice any of these symptoms, quickly move to a shady, cool or air conditioned place. Drink water and blot skin with cool damp cloth or water to help lower body temperature. Call 911 if symptoms worsen.
