CLINIC CORNER End of Year Information



Parents, please come by the clinic to pick up your student's medication on the last day of school at the end of the day on Thursday June 4th. Our nurse will give you medication order sheets for the next school year at the time. You can also print the new medication order sheet from our school website. Please make sure to get your medication order signed by the doctor over the summer and any information we need from MD such as allergy or Asthma action plans, immunization forms ,etc. Please call me if you have any questions about this. Below is the medication policy for SJCSD, please take a moment to read it.

MEDICATION POLICY

Florida Statute 1006.062 authorizes school personnel to assist students in the administration of prescription medications. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to administer medications at home prior to or after school hours. The schools **do not** keep stock medicine in the clinic.

If your child needs medication during school hours, please note the following:


- ② All medications (prescription and over-the-counter) must have a medication form signed by both the parent/guardian and the physician ordering the medication.
- ② All medications must be received in the original container with current Rx label including student's name, dosage, frequency of administration, physician's name, and expiration date of medication. Overthe-counter medications must be in the original, un-opened container. **No medication will be given if**
- ② Medications must be brought to school by parent/guardian. Please do not send any medications with your child in their backpack. Medications may not be brought to school by the student.
- ② Medication brought to school by a student will be kept in the clinic until a parent/guardian comes to the school with the required paper work. Without the required authorization, the student will not be given the medication during school hours.
- ② Medications should not be transported between home and school on a daily basis. Separate containers should be kept at home and at school.
- ② Expired medications will be disposed of upon expiration date in accordance with local requirements.

The St. Johns County School clinics provide a vital service for our students. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Building Your Child's Self-Esteem

A child with good self-esteem has better confidence and makes better choices.

Here are 10 ways to help build your child's self-esteem.

- 1. Be realistic. No one is "perfect." Don't think you have to be the best parent in the world.
- 2. Be the best role model you can be. Your child watches you every second you're together. He or she will do as you do, not as you say, so "do" the best you can.
- 3. Talk with your child, not at him or her. Show respect for your child's opinion
- 4. Openly give your love with hugs, kisses, and praise. The more a child feels loved, the more he or she will listen to you.
- 5. Lighten up. Allow yourself to laugh when things don't go as planned.
- 6. Get involved. Show your child you care about his or her life and education by taking an active role whenever possible.
- 7. Discipline with love. Treat your child fairly and firmly to establish a positive connection between the two of you. This will also give your child a foundation of solid values for life.
- 8. Spend quality time together. Schedule time to be together to talk, do chores, shop, watch TV, or any other activity that will bring greater understanding and togetherness.
- 9. Think positively. A positive attitude is contagious! If you start the day with optimism, so will your child.
- 10. Celebrate life! Acknowledge everything good that you and your child experience no matter how small. Praise can help your child learn to believe in himself or herself.


